To the Honorable the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County
of Clearfield, and State of Pennsylvania

The undersigned appointed by your honorable Body, to view a certain Road leading from ~~Mr~~ McColloughs Farm to Muddy Run in Guelich Township do respectfully Report that after due Notice being given by Posting Three Road Viewers Notices one at each end of said Road and one in most Publick Place in T^h and being duly sworn & affirmed - we proceeded to view said Road, Beginning at The dog wood corner at the Farm of Wm McCollough and running thence South 50 West 274 Perches to a Post, being on the line between Farms of Joseph McCollough & McCully Joseph Thompson & D. Smith old in, in our Farms, thence North 63 West 14 Perches to a Pine, through Timber, thence South 65 West 91 Perches to a Pine, through Timber, thence South 39 West 140 Perches to a Hemlock, through Timber except small improvements on East side of John Bloom & M Robinsons thence South 42 West ^{13 Perches} to a Hemlock, through Timber, thence North 71 West 28 Perches to a Beech, through Timber, thence North one West 28 Perches to Muddy Run, through Timber, as per annexed draft connected with the original Opening Order, and find that said Road has never been opened when it was laid except the first 274 Perches, that there is no occasion for said Road, either as a Publick or Private Road in our Judgment, and that it should be vacated according to the Prayer of the Petitioners, and for the Reasons set forth in the

Petition, and so we report this 24th day of February 1872

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of January, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Gulick, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience

~~for the want of a road or highway, leading from~~ Grievances by reason of a certain public Road which has become burthensome leading from McLoughs farm to Muddy Run

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{vacate} ~~lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

W. B. Dickinson John Bloom ^{vacation} ~~and~~ In Copenhagen who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{vacation}; and if any two of them agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such ~~road~~, they shall ^{vacate} ~~proceed to lay out~~ the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, ~~having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property;~~

and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
