We the undersigned viewers appointed by the above
order of Court to view and lay out the road therein
mentioned respectfully report. —

That having given due and public notice
of the time and place of said view by printed
handbills as required by the act of Assembly, we
met at the time and place appointed and after
being duly sworn or affirmed according to law
and all viewers being present, we went upon the
ground proposed for said view, and having
viewed the same we report for private use the
following road to wit: — Beginning at the lane above
Josiah Harman's house on line between Josiah Harman
and John G. Schmidt; thence by said line South
One degree West 18 perches to corner of Josiah Harman and
John Lais (line west); thence on 52 per = 70 per. to corner
of John G. Schmidt and Geo. J. Weaver (line left or east)
thence still on by same bearing between Geo. J. Weaver (Old
Woodside Tract) and John Lais 33 per. total distance of
road 103 perches to intersect public road on line between
Geo. J. Weaver and John Lais; a draft or plot whereof
is herunto annexed which said road we report as
necessary and we further report no damages to ac-
crued from said road.

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of January, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from

*The lane above Josiah
Harmon's House to intersect the public road
on the line between George J. Weaver and
John Sais*
Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

David Ream, Adam Rishel and Wm Radaker
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
