Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of Sept, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Graham, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near the mouth of Little Spring run on the Moravian road to intersect the public road at or near George Warehous.

"Report as to Damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey, C. Hurley and Andrew Smeal who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned Respectfully Report; That having given notice of the time and place of the view, according to the act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said road, and being all first severally Sworn or Affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and laid out; and do return the following road viz: Beginning at the Public Road, where it crosses the line between George Vasegood, and Amos Hubler, (near George Vasegood's) Thence on their line North three degrees East Eighty two perches to a small pine, Thence through Land of William Stickler and Benjamin Spackman, North fifty seven and a half degrees West fifty three perches to a Post, Thence North seventeen and a half degrees East; Twenty five and three tenths perches to a stump, Thence North eleven degrees East; Twenty nine perches to a Post on the line between Spackman & Jacob Wilhelm, near the School House. Thence along the line of Spackman & Wilhelm, North Eighty seven degrees East; Eighty three and five tenths perches to a Pine stump Thence through Jacob Wilhelm's Land North Eighty degrees West Twenty four perches, to a Post. Thence South Eighty and a half degrees West fourteen perches to a Post or stump on the line of Jacob and William Wilhelm, Thence along their line, North Eighty seven degrees West; Eighteen perches to corner of Jacob & John Wilhelm Thence through Land of Isaac Tyler same course North Eighty Eight (98) perches to a Post; Thence North fifty nine degrees West; Cross the line of Tyler into Land of Patrick Curley. Thirty four perches to a dead Pine North thirty three degrees West; Twenty four perches to a Pine stump. North ~~Three~~ degrees East; Twenty six and five tenths perches to a Post Thence South Eighty Eight degrees West; Eighty two perches to a Post. Thence South seventy six degrees East; Ten perches.

Thence South Eighty four and a half degrees West twenty five perches North Seventy One degrees West; Thirty and five tenths perches to the line of Patrick Curley and Andrew Smeal. Thence along the line between them North two and a half degrees East; Twenty three and eight tenths perches to the corner of Andrew Smeal, and Jacob Reinhardt; on the line of Patrick Curley. Thence between Andrew Smeal and Jacob Reinhardt; North Eighty seven degrees West thirty four perches to the Dear Creek Road, by the School House. Which said road as aforesaid laid out we are of opinion is necessary for a public Road. A draft whereof is herewith annexed.

From the last mentioned point to the mouth of "Little Spring Run" about one mile distant we are of opinion is not necessary, and would be very expensive to make being on the side of a rough, steep mountain; and it being the desire of all the petitioners present we agree to Report as above.

And further that there is no damage claimed by parties present, and we believe no one is entitled to receive any.
