bridge, do fix and ascertain the sum of money ne-
cessary to be appropriated by the County of Clearfield
out of its Treasury towards the erection of the bridge
aforesaid at the sum of One thousand five hundred

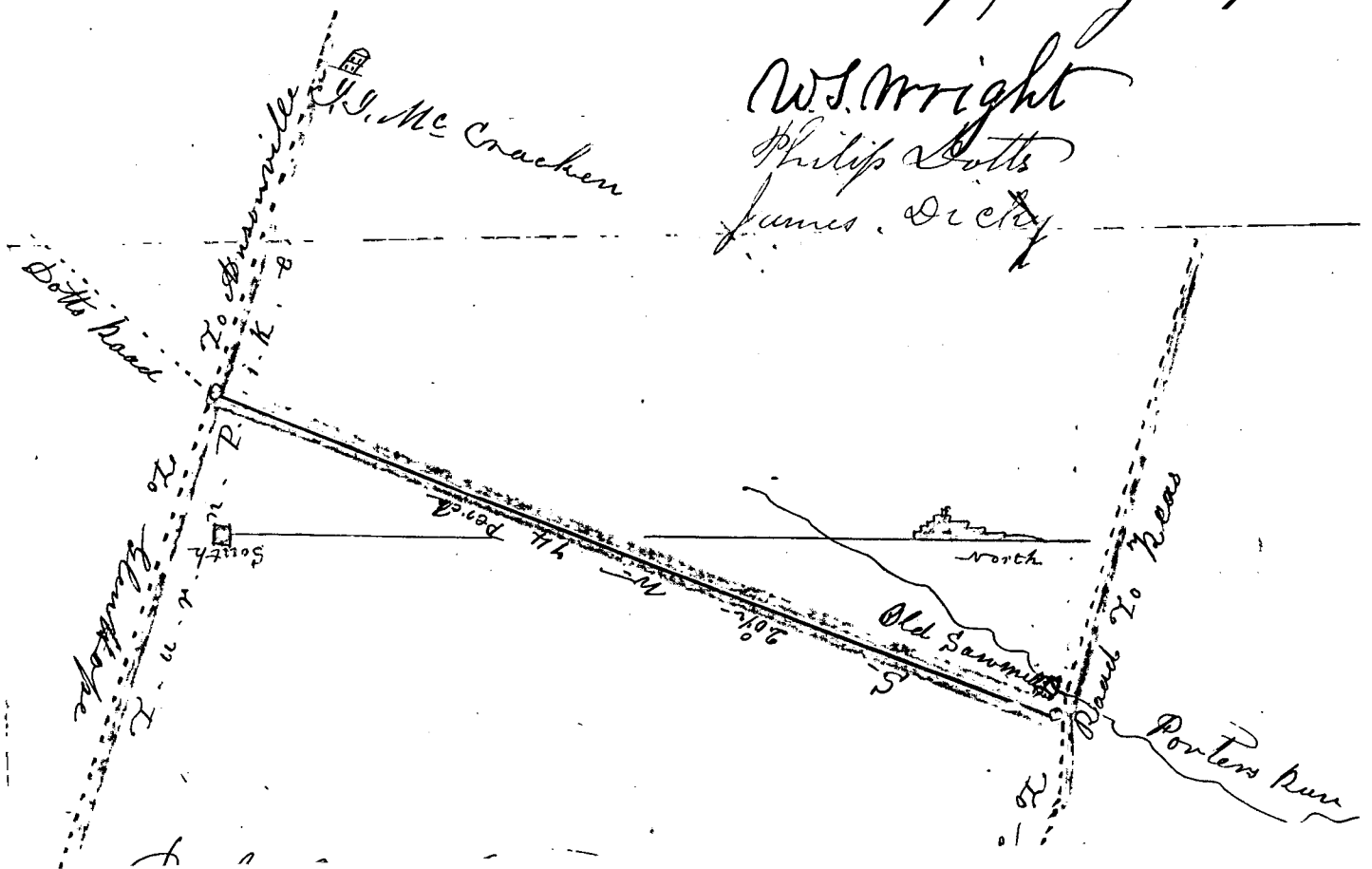

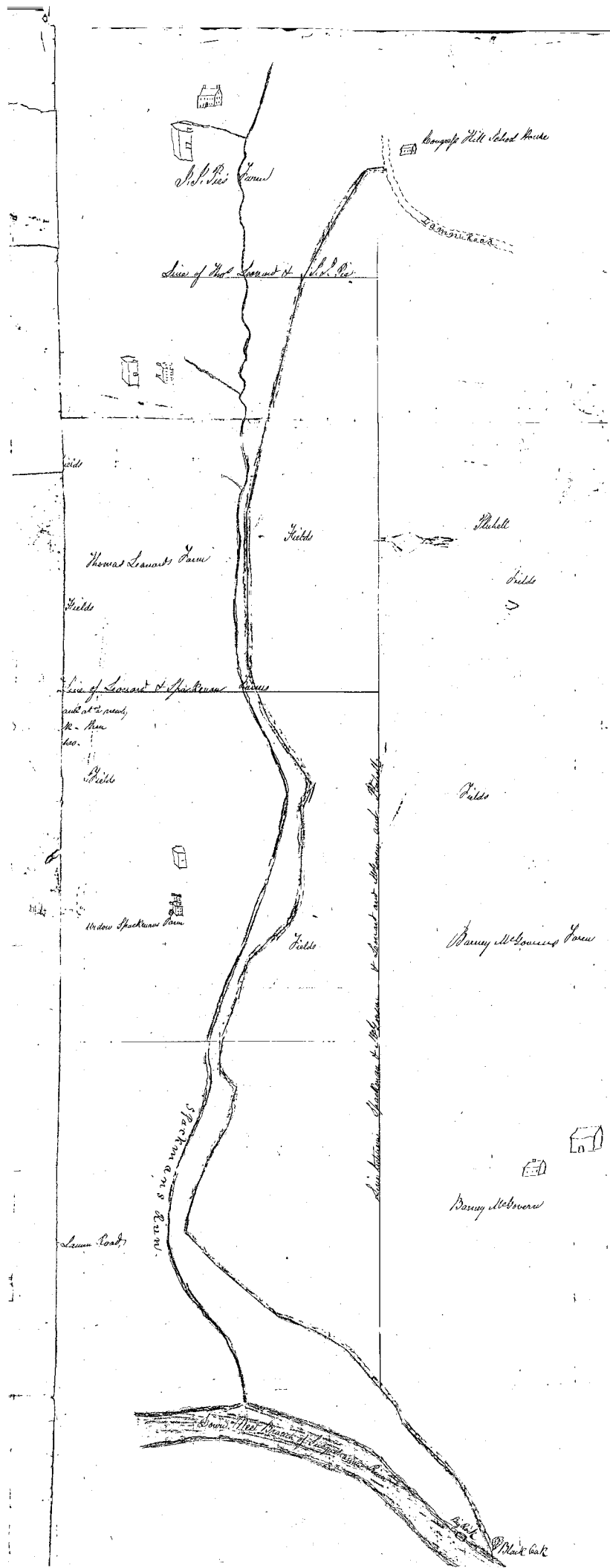
