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ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of January, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Goshen, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Public Road at or near David Shirey's place to public Road at or near Harrison Spences farm

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John S. Leettle, Rich. Shaw Jr. and Peter Owens

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

Beginning at Public Road near David Shieps, thence north $2\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West 60 perches to White Pine, thence North 15° East twenty three perches, North 58° West eighteen perches, North 34° East twenty perches, North $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West seventeen perches, (to Thompson Reed's field) North 83° West fourteen perches, North $3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East 46 perches to House and Barn, South 82° West sixteen perches, North 10° West Twenty eight perches, North 17° W. nineteen perches, North forty eight perches, thence through fields of W. G. 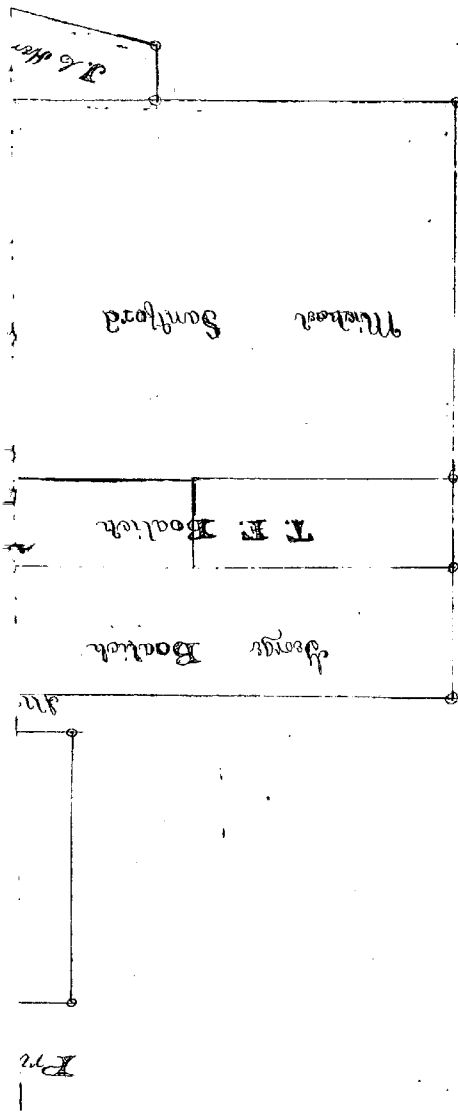

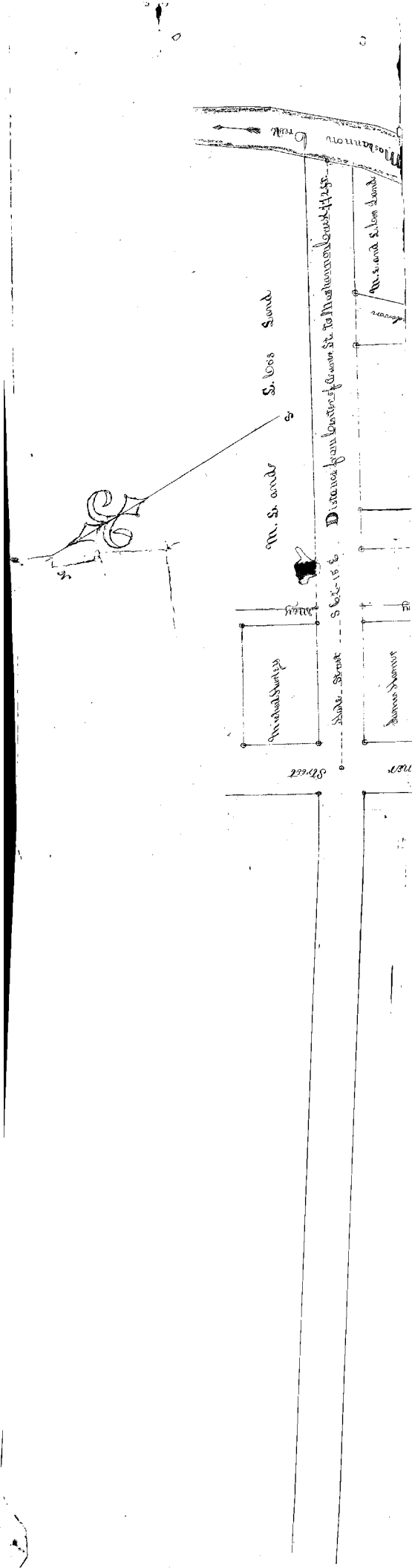
Map of the Extension of H. S. Street

ally accrue to the owners of the lot by the
opening of said street. -
