To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for
Clearfield County.

The undersigned inhabitants of Clearfield County residing in the
townships of Chest, Ferguson Pennside & and the Borough of New Washington
respectfully remonstrate against the confirmation of a road lately laid out from at
or near Brown Baratts, to the Public road near Newburg ^{in said township of Chest} for the following reasons.

1st That a road has long since been laid out from "Broadway" on the Glen Hope &
Piedmont Turnpike in Ferguson Township to wit in 1856. which road has been confirmed
absolutely by the Court for fifteen years last past, but has not been opened in several places.

2nd That said road was well laid upon good ground and fair grade, and is much
needed not only by the people of Chest Township, but by all who desire to travel thence
to New Washington and Pennside Townships, that said road ends at Newburg the
terminus of the road now asked to be set aside -

3rd In view of the road so long confirmed never having been opened, your Petitioners
respectfully ask that an order of Court be made upon the Supervisors of Chest Township
to open said road forthwith, as the road they are now compelled to travel is absolutely
dangerous to all who use it, as less than one mile of new road is required to make
it safe and easy to travel, and they will pray the

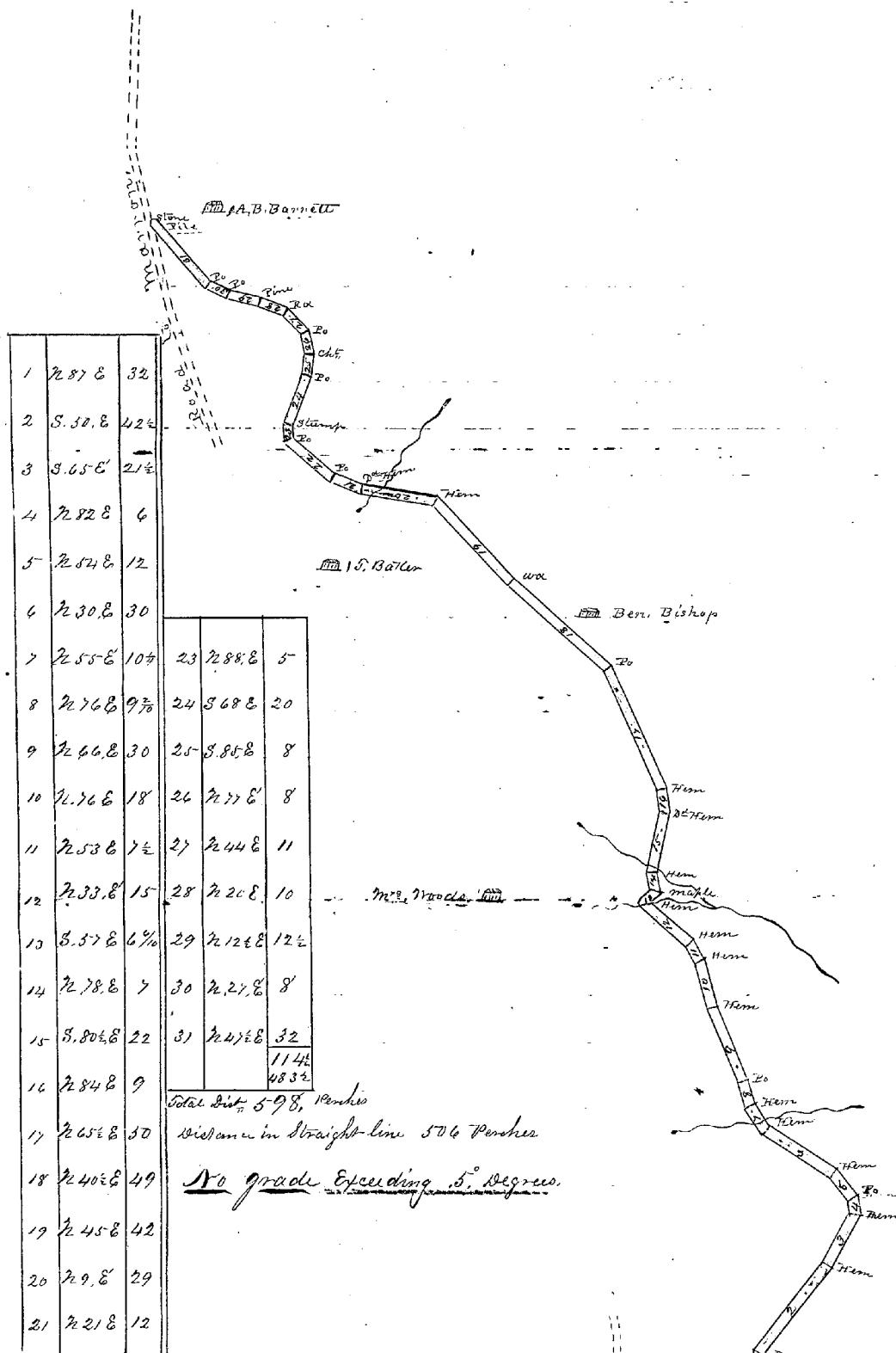
To the Honorable Judges within named -

We the persons appointed by the within order of Court to review the road therein mentioned having first been duly sworn and affirmed, according to Law Do Report That in pursuance of the said order after having given ten days notice by written & printed advertisements put up according to Law of the time and place of said review and having given notice to the owners and occupants of land through which said road was intended to pass of the same. And we having enquired as to the Damages resulting to any one by reason of the passage of said road have ascertained that no Damage results to any one. Road View Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of January, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Chest-, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway leading from~~ Review on Public road lately layed out (and not yet confirmed absolutely) leading from Wilson's run near Newburg to A.B. Barretts

"Report as to damages"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thos. W. Moore Jr. & T. Straw & Sarah Baker

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

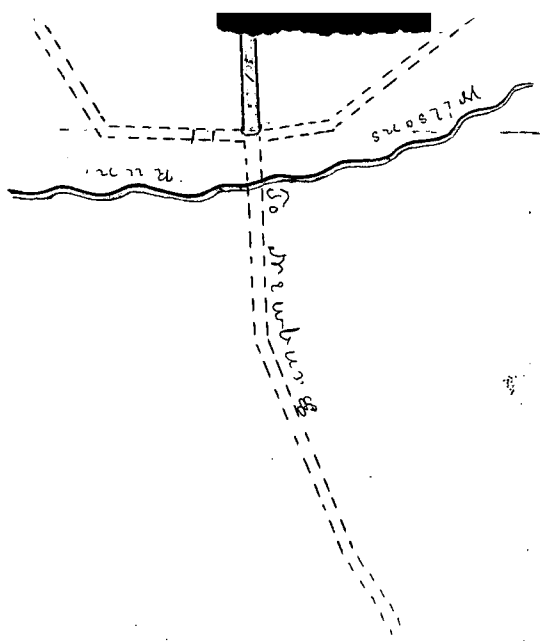
