D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Morris, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience and greatly burthened and is inconvenient and useless ~~for the want of a road or highway, leading from~~.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ~~view~~ ^{view} ~~vacate~~ ^{vacate} and ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

O. S. Schoonover, Thos Kyler and Jas. S. Stewart
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{vacation}; and if any two of them agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same unnecessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
