Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23^d day of Sept, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bloom & Union, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from

at or near Wm H. Pinchois in
Bloom Tp. to at or near John Sheesers
in Union Tp

Report as to Damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Geo. C. Kirk, H. B. Bailey & Sam Hollopeter

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To The Honourable, The Judges within
named: We the undersigned, appointed by The
annexed order do report, That in pursuance thereof,
after having been duly sworn according to law, viewed
the ground proposed for said road, and we do
agree that there is occasion for a road as desired
by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary
for a public road. And having had respect to
the shortest distance and the best ground for such
road, we have laid out in such manner, as in
our opinion shall do the least injury to private
property, and as far as practicable agreeably to
the desire of the petitioners, and do return for
public use the following described road, to wit:
Beginning at a Post on the Public road near
Orr Panchies; Thence North 20° East, one hun-
dred and fourteen Perches to a Post, Thence
North 40° East fifty-one Perches to a Red Oak;
Thence North 83° East, forty Perches to a Beech;
Thence North 25° East, Ninety-four perches to
a Hemlock; Thence North 45° East, Thirty-two
perches to a Hemlock; Thence North 60° East,
forty-four perches to a Post; Thence North 15° West,
Thirty-eight perches to a Post; Thence North 41° West,
Thirty-eight perches to a Chestnut Stump; Thence
North 5° West, Twenty and seven Perches to
a Post; Thence North 30° East Twenty-six
Perches to a Post; Thence North, Sixty-eight per-
ches to a Post; Thence North, 28° West Twenty-
three perches to a Post; Thence North 40° West
twenty-two perches to a Post; Thence South 73°
West, forty-two perches to a Post; Thence North
72° West, twenty-seven perches to a Post; Thence
North 46° West, Ninety-six perches to Post in
Public road, leading from Luthemburg to
Arnold's Mills, said road being at an eleva-
tion not exceeding five degrees. The unders-
igned further report that there are no dam-
ages resulting to any one by reason of the
road passing through their lands, and
that before the said view, public notice of
the time and place of the meeting of the
viewers was given by advertisements put up
at three of the most public places in the vic-
inity—ten days before said meeting, and
we annex a plot or draft of said road laid
out, stating the courses and distances, and no-
ticing briefly the improvements through which
the same passes.
