Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of June, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Houston, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Near the Wilson run
Bridge at Pennfield up Wilson Run to the
county line at or near the head of said
run

Report as to Damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Heiram Woodward, S. Bird and Mr. Tyler

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

The undersigned appointed to
view a road from Penfield up Wilson Run to the Elk
County line near Loughblack Springs - would respectfully report.
They have viewed the proposed route and find a fair grade
almost most of the way good ground for a road using a
lumber road for over 500 rods. It passes through no
improvements except those of Hiram Woodward who claims no
damages. The road is necessary as a means of developing
the County and of communication between Bronte's Branch
and lower John waters. and on recommendation that a
road be located substantially according to the survey
plans attached.
