CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

AT a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the county of Clearfield, held at Clearfield town, in and for said county, on the Fourteenth day of June A. D. 1862, before the Judges of said court, Geo. C. Kirk and M. H. Luther and Andrew Bentz Sr., the persons appointed by an order of the said Court of Quarter Sessions, last past, to view and lay out a road from at or near John Shaffers to at or near Rumbarger School House in Brady.

Do Report, that, in persua nce of the said order they have viewed and laid out, and do return for public use, the following road, to wit:—**BEGINNING** at a stone in public road at Rumbargers School House thence 78° East 42 perches to Maple - thence S. 86° E. 33 perches to post on bridge across Bentz Run - thence South 58° E. 18 perches to a pine Stump - thence S. 76° E. 37½ per. to dead Hemlock - thence S. 68¼° East 107 perches to post in public road leading from M. Shaffers to J. Rumbarger near John Shaffers. Also Tax Dixon

as Assessed damages to the amount
of few Dollars.

a plot or draft whereof is to the said Report annexed, which Report being read the first time at September Sessions last, and the second time on the Twentieth day of January instant, the Court approve of and confirm the said road for public use, and order and direct that it be entered of record, and opened and cleared off the breadth of 33 feet, except where digging or bridging is necessary and there to be sixteen feet agreeable to the courses and distances aforesaid, of which the Supervisors of the highways of the tow nships through which the said road runs are to take notice.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of June, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near John Shafers leading by nearest and best route to at or near the Rumbarger School House in Brady Lps.

"Report as to damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Ges. L. Kirk, Martin H. Luther & Andy Penty Sr who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable, the judges with
in: We the undersigned, appointed by
the annexed order do report, that in
pursuance thereof, after having been
duly sworn according to law, all the
viewers appointed by said order, view-
ed the grounds proposed for the within
mentioned road, and we do agree that
there is occasion for a road as desired
by the petitioners, and that the same
is necessary for a public road. And
having had respect to the shortest dis-
tance and the best grounds for such roads
we have laid out in such manner as
shall, in our opinion do the least dam-
age to private property, and as far as we
practicable, agreeably to the desire of the pe-
titioners, and do return for public use

the following described road, to wit:—
Beginning at a stone in the public
road, at the Rumbarger School house;
thence South Seventy-eight degrees East,
forty-two perches to a Maple tree; thence
South Eighty-six degrees East, thirty-three
perches to a Post, on the bridge across the
~~Penit~~ run; thence South Fifty-eight
degrees East, eighteen perches, to a
Pine stump; thence South Seventy-five de-
grees East, twenty-seven and a half perches
to a Hemlock, (dead) thence South Six-
ty-eight and a fourth degrees East, one
hundred and one perches to a Post
in public road leading from Mr. Shaff-
er to J. Rumbarger, and near John
Shaffers. We further report that we
have made careful inquiry as to any
damages that may arise from the opening
of said road, to find that there are no
damages claimed by any one through wh-
ose land the road passes, except to James
Dixon, and therefore, having taken into Con-
sideration the advantages to be derived to the
said James Dixon, from the road passing thor-
ough his land, we have assessed the damages
sustained by the said James Dixon, at ten
dollars. We further report, that before the said
view, public notice of the time and place of
the meeting of the viewers was given by adver-
tisements put up at three of the most public
places in the vicinity - ten days before said
Meeting. We also annex a plot or draft of said
road laid out, stating the courses and distan-
ces, and noticing briefly the improvements thor-
ough which the same passes.
