





C O M P L A I N T

Now comes Frederick F. Wheeler, the Plaintiff above named, and states his cause of action against Norman K. Owens in the manner and form following:

(1). That the Plaintiff is an adult individual residing at R. D. #1, Woodland, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

(2). That the Defendant is an individual residing at 1119 Dorey Street, Clearfield, Pennsylvania.

(3). That on or about May 13, 1960 at about 2:45 p.m., the Plaintiff was the owner of a 1954 Lincoln Capri 2-door hardtop, license No. N10832, which was being operated by Dorothy M. Wheeler in an easterly direction on East Market Street in the Borough of Clearfield, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania, at and near the intersection of East Market Street and Cemetery Road.

(4). That at the time and place aforesaid the Defendant was the owner and operator of a 1949 Pontiac, license No. 691527, which was being operated in a southerly direction downgrade on Cemetery Road, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania and entered East Market Street, said vehicle then traveling in a westerly direction.

(5). That at the time and place aforesaid the vehicle of the Defendant proceeded across the center of East Market Street and struck the left side of the Plaintiff's vehicle, which was then in its own lane of travel.

(6). That at the time and place aforesaid the Defendant was negligent in the following respects:

a. That the Defendant failed to have his motor vehicle under

proper control.

b. That the Defendant failed to yield one-half the traveled portion of the highway to oncoming traffic.


c. That the Defendant failed to observe oncoming traffic.

d. That the Defendant operated his motor vehicle at a high and excessive rate of speed under the conditions then existing.

(7). That by reason of the negligence of the Defendant, as aforesaid, the motor vehicle of the Defendant struck the left side of the motor vehicle of the Plaintiff causing damage thereto to the extent of One Hundred Fifty-four and 87/100 (\$154.87) Dollars, as set out in an estimate of repairs of the Adams Paint and Body Shop, copy of which is marked Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff claims of the Defendant damages in the sum of One Hundred Fifty-four and 87/100 (\$154.87) Dollars, together with damages for delay in payment of the same and costs of suit.
