COMPLAINT

Now comes MARJORY D. WEBER, Plaintiff above named, and brings this Complaint in Divorce against her husband, FREDERICK S. WEBER, on a cause of action whereof the following is a statement:

1. That the name of the Plaintiff is MARJORY D. WEBER and the name of the Defendant is FREDERICK S. WEBER.
2. That both parties are adults and competent.
3. That the said Plaintiff and Defendant were married in on June 22, 1956, DuBois, Pennsylvania.
4. That at the time of the said marriage, the Plaintiff and Defendant were natural born citizens of the United States, said Plaintiff having resided in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania all her life.
5. That the present residence of the Plaintiff is 132 South Brady Street, DuBois, Pennsylvania; and the present residence of the Defendant is 4241 Colorado Avenue, Lorain, Ohio.
6. That there were no children born to this marriage.
7. That no prior divorce action has been instituted by either party.
8. That in violation of his marriage vows and the laws of this Commonwealth, the said Defendant has offered such indignities to the person of the Plaintiff as to render her condition intolerable and life burdensome.

9. That the said defendant has wilfully absented himself from the habitation of the plaintiff and has wilfully and without just cause deserted said plaintiff for a period of three years and upwards, to wit, from October 15, 1957, until the present date.

10. This action is not brought out of collusion.

WHEREFORE, the plaintiff prays that she be freed and separated from the bonds of matrimony heretofore contracted between the said Plaintiff and Defendant and be granted a decree in divorce a vinculo matrimonii dissolving the bonds of the said marriage.

MASTER'S REPORT

TO THE HONORABLE JOHN J. PENTZ, PRESIDENT JUDGE:

The undersigned Master, appointed by the Court to take testimony and report the same with form of Decree, represents as follows:

SCHEDULE

1. Complaint in Divorce: Complaint filed August 7, 1961. One copy certified to attorney.
2. Service: Service of the Complaint was made upon the defendant by sending to him a true and attested copy of the Complaint by Registered Mail, Deliver to Addressee Only, with Return Receipt Requested; said attested copy of the Complaint was delivered to the defendant on August 9, 1961 as shown by the Return Receipt which is attached hereto.
3. Appointment of Master: Ervin S. Fennell, Jr. was appointed Master on September 13, 1961.
4. Date and Place fixed for Hearing: The Master's hearing was scheduled for October 13, 1961 at 4:00 p. m. in the Robert V. Maine Law Offices, 228 DuBois Deposit National Bank Building, DuBois, Pennsylvania.
5. Notice of Master's Hearing: Service of the Master's Notice was made by the Master by certified mail, return receipt requested, on September 21, 1961, as appears from the enclosed Return of Service of Master's Notice with certified mail return receipt attached.
6. Master's Hearing: The Master's Hearing was held at the time and place aforesaid. Edward V. Cherry appeared as attorney for the plaintiff, who appeared in person. No other witnesses appeared for plaintiff. The defendant did not appear in person or by counsel. Testimony was taken in question and answer form.

CAUSE OF DIVORCE

Desertion

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Marriage: The plaintiff and defendant were married in DuBois, Pennsylvania on June 22, 1956.

2. Residence and Citizenship: The plaintiff and defendant are natural born citizens of the United States. They lived in Falls Creek after their marriage until October of 1957, at which time the defendant left the plaintiff. The plaintiff then moved to DuBois, where she has been living since that time, her present address being the Moose Apartments on Brady Street. The present address of the defendant is 4241 Colorado Avenue, Lorain, Ohio.

3. Ages and Occupations: The age of the plaintiff is 40 and that of the defendant is 40. The plaintiff is employed by Jeffers Electronics in DuBois and the defendant is employed as a truck driver for the Ford Motor Company in Lorain, Ohio.

4. Children: There were no children born to this marriage.

5. Armed Forces: Neither the plaintiff nor the defendant is a member of any branch of the armed forces of the United States, as appears from the attached testimony.

6. Findings on the Merits: The evidence submitted in support of the charge of desertion justifies the following findings:

(a) For sixteen months after their marriage plaintiff and defendant lived in Falls Creek, Pennsylvania. After a weekend of arguments and general marital discord, defendant left plaintiff on October 15, 1957, proceeded to his place of employment and never returned to the marital abode. To the present time defendant has never attempted to resume the marital relationship with plaintiff and has continuously absented himself from his wife's presence since deserting her. Plaintiff stated in her testimony that she did not give defendant any reason or cause to leave her.

(b) The plaintiff was a good and dutiful wife.

(c) There is no evidence of collusion to obtain a divorce.

DISCUSSION

In the opinion of the Master the charge of desertion was established by the testimony of the plaintiff. The defendant's actions clearly established a wilful and malicious desertion of plaintiff in excess of the statutory period of two years. It has many times been held that a decree in divorce may be supported by the testimony of the plaintiff alone. *Macormac v. Macormac*, 159 Pa. S. 378; *Kett v. Kett*, 117 Pa. S. 236.

There is nothing in the testimony to show that the plaintiff by her words or conduct said or did anything to justify the conduct of the defendant.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Court has jurisdiction of the subject matter and the parties.
2. The defendant is guilty of the desertion of the plaintiff, contrary to subsection 1(d) of the Act of May 2, 1929, P. L. 1237, section 10, and (23 P. S. 10), as supplemented and amended,
3. The proceedings conform to the rules of Court and the requirements of the law.
4. The plaintiff is an injured and innocent spouse.

RECOMMENDATION

The Master recommends a Decree granting Marjory D. Weber a divorce a vinculo matrimonii from Frederick S. Weber, a form of Decree being hereto attached.

MARJORY D. WEBER, being produced and sworn testifies
as follows:

BY MR. CHERRY:

Q. When and where were you married?

A. June 22, 1956 at DuBois, Pennsylvania.

Q. Where did you reside when you were first married?

A. Falls Creek, Pennsylvania.

Q. Is that in Jefferson County?

A. Yes, it is.

Q. How long did you reside at this residence in Falls
Creek, Pennsylvania?

A. June, 1956 to October, 1957.

Q. Then where did you and your husband reside?

A. That's when my husband left me and I moved to
DuBois Street, DuBois, Pennsylvania.

Q. How long have you lived at this residence on DuBois
Street, DuBois, Pennsylvania?

A. I lived there about six months .

Q. And then where did you move to?

A. Brady Street in DuBois.

Q. And how long did you live at this residence on Brady
Street, DuBois, Pennsylvania?

A. One year.

Q. Where did you move to then?

A. In the Moose apartment on Brady Street.

Q. And that's in DuBois, Pennsylvania?

A. Yes, it is.

Q. Is that where you live at the present time?

A. Yes, it is.

Q. Are you a citizen of the United States?

A. Yes, I am.

Q. Is your husband a citizen of the United States?

A. Yes.

Q. What is your age and occupation?

A. I'm forty and I work at Jeffers.

Q. Jeffers, is that a factory in DuBois, Pennsylvania?

A. Yes, it is.

Q. What is the age and present occupation of your husband, the Defendant in this case?

A. He is forty years old and he is a Truck Driver for Ford Motors, in Lorain, Ohio.

Q. Do you know the present residence of your husband?

A. 4241 Colorado Avenue, Lorain, Ohio.

Q. Were there any children born to this marriage?

A. No.

Q. What would you say was the chief cause of your marital difficulty?

A. The interference of his mother in our marriage.

Q. In what way would this cause trouble in your household?

A. She was always interfering, she insisted that I do things her way. She wanted me to run my house the way she told me to, and he thought I should listen to her.

Q. And was this the constant source of trouble in your household?

A. Yes, it was.

Q. Mrs. Weber, you stated your complaint for divorce that your husband deserted you for a period of three years and upwards starting as of October 15, 1957, would you mind telling us

what happened on October 15, 1957?

A. Well, we argued this one weekend and he went back to work and didn't come back.

Q. And have you been separated ever since from that date?

A. Yes, we have.

Q. And has your husband made any effort to resume marital relationship with you from that date?

A. No.

Q. Did you give him any reason or cause for him to leave you?

A. I don't believe I did. I always prepared his meals for him when he was home and took care of his clothes, and kept the home up. I just wouldn't listen to his mother and she always interfered and I just couldn't put up with it, so we argued every weekend. So the last argument we had he got mad and went out of the house with his clothes and just didn't come back.

Q. So he made no effort to resume this marital relation with you from the date that he left, October 15, 1957, until the present date?

A. No, he hasn't.

Q. Were there any children born to this marriage?

A. No, there weren't.

Q. Have you heard at all from your husband since the date of the desertion, October 15, 1957, to the present date?

A. Yes, he's written me a few letters in the last year asking me to get a divorce.

Q. And is that the reason why you brought this divorce action?

A. No, that is not the reason. I just decided myself

that we would never get back together again so I decided to get a divorce on my own.

Q. So, Mrs. Weber you state that you did not do anything that would cause your husband to desert you, is that correct?

A. That is right.
