ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 11th day of January, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of J. G. Barger ~~sundry~~ inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in the said county, setting forth that ~~they~~ ^{he} labor under great inconvenience for the want of ~~a road or highway, leading from~~ having his farm that is now connected with the Bradford Independent School District struck into Bradford Township for school purposes &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{Report on} ~~lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Earl H. Turner Josiah B. Read & Isaac Shimmel

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ^{Premises} ~~ground proposed for said road~~; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to

~~the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the~~

^{the benefit of petitioners} ~~the same agreeably to~~ ^{to the} next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

The undersigned, appointed by the annexed
order, Commissioners for the purpose therein
mentioned, Respectfully report:-

That having given notice to the inhabitants of
the township of Bradford of the time and place
of their meeting as in said order directed, they met
at the house of ~~James~~ Wesley Barber, in said township
residing in said Independent School Dist, on the
9th day of March, A.D. 1872, and having been
duly sworn and affirmed to perform the duties
assigned to them by said order with fidelity;
and having inquired into the propriety of grant-
ing the prayer of the petition in said order men-
tioned, they made a plot or draft of the said Inde-
pendent School Dist, and also of ^{the} property of the
said petitioners ~~of said~~ in said Dist, and also of
the division line proposed to be made therein,
(which said plot or draft is hereto annexed)
the lines of which are as follows. Beginning
at the South East Corner of land owned by Henry
Lumsberry, Thence east, about 234 poles to post,
Thence North about 80 perches to White oak,
Thence West about 20 perches to post, Thence North
about 90 perches to Pitch pine, Thence West, about 94
perches to post. - Thence South 1 1/4 perches more
or less to place of Beginning, Being same premises

upon which Rachel Burger widow of
Peter Burger dec^d. now lives. —

They further report that they are of the
opinion, that the said premises as described
should be stricken out of the said Independ-
ant List - As the occupants of said prem-
ises labor under great inconvenience in
sending to School, to the School House
erected in said Independent School
District, and that in their opinion
it is proper & that the prayer of the
petitioners should be granted, and that
the said premises as described should
be stricken out of the said List. —

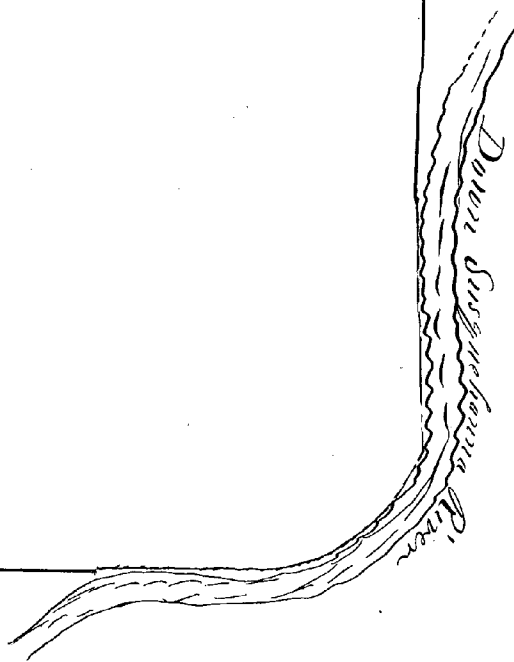

Exceptions to Proceedings.

- 1" The order does not contain an explicit direction to inquire into the propriety of granting the prayer of the petition^{er} or
- 2" The Report of the Commissioners is not sufficiently explicit in this respect even if it were it does not remedy the fatal defect in the order.
- 3" The Writ does not designate the location of the petitioner's residence, nor that of the school house in the township and that in the Independent District, thus entirely failing to show the respective distances. In this it is fatally defective.
- 4" Other illegalities and irregularities.
