

 sworn did go upon the ground described in  
 the within order of Court And having exam-  
 ined the premises did proceed to lay out  
 and return for public use the following  
 road to art - Beginning at point where  
 the road leading <sup>from</sup> Lanicks to McPherson  
 Mill road crosses the line of the Brocia and  
 Thos McPherson thence along said division  
 line to the aforesaid road And we also  
 vacate and declare useless the old road  
 from the point above spoken of where the  
 road crosses the McPherson and Brocia  
 line and thence to the aforesaid sp.  
 road - the road on line layed this  
 day to take its place



The dotted line re-  
 presenting the old road and this day vacated  
 and the straight line marked "new Road" is returned  
 for future use

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of June, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway, leading from~~ Review, vacation and supply of that portion of public road leading from Thomas Sanieck to McPhersons Mill which runs through lands of Thos. M. McPherson and William Brocia.

Report as to Damages etc

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Geo. H. Hall, Henry Gulich and Matt. Ogden who, ~~are~~ being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
