

WHEREAS Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

on the 7th day of August in the year of our Lord
one thousand nine hundred fifty six obtained judgment in our
County Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield county aforesaid, before our Judge, at Clearfield,
against Norman P. Williams and Christina M. Petriskie

late of your county yeoman, as well as a certain debt of \$ 500.00
lawful money of the United States, with interest from -- as also

and effect of the recovery and judgment aforesaid, if to them shall seem expedient.

unto them and this writ.


