

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of November, A. D. 1872 before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Lawrence, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from a point on the Erie Turnpike near the Spackman farm to the Little Clearfield Creek at the Boggs & ~~Key~~ Township Line Report as to damages etc

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John S. Cattell, J. B. Read & Miles Read

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace now being held at June Sessions 1873, in and for the County of Clearfield.

The undersigned viewers appointed by your Honors in and by the order hereto annexed, Respectfully report, That they gave due and timely notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, by advertisement duly posted in public places in the township of Lawrence, for more than five days before making the view, and having been first duly affirmed according to law, proceeded to view and lay out the following road, Beginning on the north side of Little Clearfield Creek, near a large ^{at Boggs Township line} ^{thence North forty four degrees West to the (12) perches} White Pine stump, thence North twenty three degrees West twenty two perches, North forty three degrees West (8) eight perches, North thirty five degrees West, (12) twelve perches to north side of small run, North fourteen degrees West, (20) perches, North thirty six degrees West (12) twelve perches to old road, thence North thirty two degrees West, (14) fourteen perches, North twenty seven degrees West, (18) eighteen perches, North forty five degrees West, (4) four perches, North twenty one and one half degrees West, (20) twenty perches, North six degrees West, (16) sixteen perches, North sixteen West, (22) twenty two perches, North four degrees West, (14) fourteen perches, North thirty degrees East, (10) ten perches, North rising spring run to left eight (8) perches, North thirty six degrees West, (26) twenty six perches to opposite James Dougherty's house, North twenty three and one half degrees West, (30) thirty perches, North forty three degrees west, (56) fifty six perches to a White Pine, North thirty three West, (88) eighty eight perches to tract line, and North five degrees West, forty eight (48) to Erie Turnpike, on east side of Spackman Farm, which road we return for public use, and believe the same to be necessary, all which is respectfully submitted.
