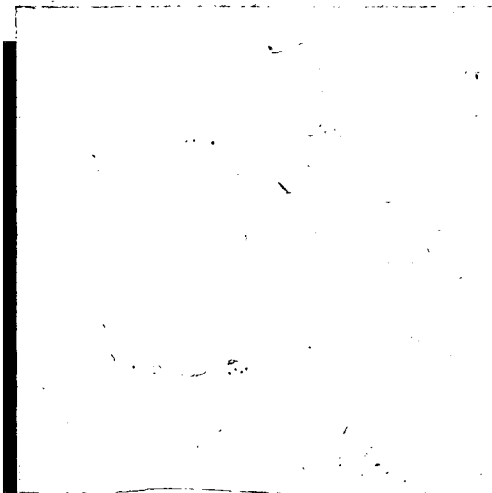

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of November, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bradford, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Fultons Dead water

at or near Robert Leonard to intersect
the public Road at or near John Peters

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John L. Cuttle, John Parks & J. A. D. & Isaac
Isaac Wilson

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

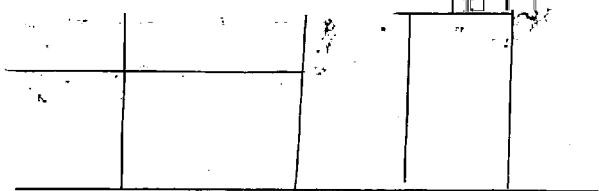

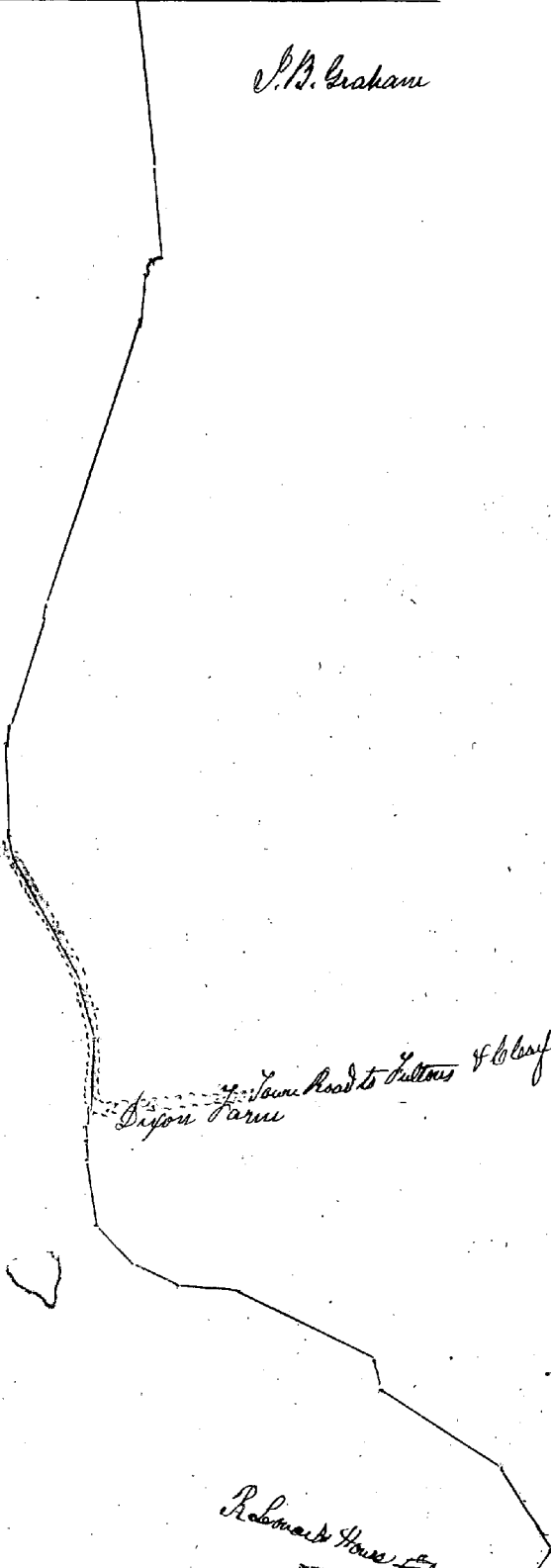

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the
County of Bedford now holding a General Sessions of the Peace at Septem-
ber Term A.D. 1843.

The undersigned viewers appointed by your Honors
to view and lay out the road in the within Order of appointment hereto
annexed;

Respectfully Report;

That in pursuance of said order the
viewers to wit: John L. Cuttle, John Parks and Isaac Wilson met, and
having been first duly sworn or affirmed according to law, examined the
ground proposed for said road, having given due, timely, and legal notice
of the time and place of meeting of the viewers by advertisements duly
posted in public places in Bradford Township, for more than five days
previous to the time of making the view, Proceeded to lay out the said road
by the following courses and distances, Beginning at a ~~Red Oak~~ on the bank
of the Susquehanna River at the corner of Robert Leonard's field at Suttons
Dead Water, thence South 36° West 35 perches, thence South 65° East 37 perches
South 58° East 55 perches, South 20° East twelve perches, South 65° East 60 perches,
South 84° East 24 perches, South 65° East, eighteen perches, South 50° East
twenty two perches, South 10° East twenty six perches, South 3° West
six perches, South 15° West six perches, South 5° West four perches,
South 2° West, twenty six perches, thence by Town Road leading to Suttons Ford
South 19° East twenty one perches, South 30° East fifty four perches, and
South 15° East twelve perches, then left Township Road, and South 5° East
thirty two perches, South 10° West six perches, South 18° West forty four
perches, South 5° West four perches, South 18° W. One hundred and fifteen
perches, South 6° West, eighteen perches, South 10° West four perches
South thirty eight perches, South 7° East sixty three perches, South
 3° West, twenty eight perches to White oak corner at field of John Peters Estate
and thence course One hundred and twenty six perches, between Peters Est & boundary, 126 per
ches, and we return the said road for Public use, as it is not only
necessary for the convenience of the settlers but is of great use to
the people engaged in lumbering, in the Spring. Suttons Dead Water
being a point where a large number of rafts can be safely harbored

following exceptions to Confirmation absolute
of said road.

1st The record shows that order to view was
made Nov. 26th 1872: and no further action
taken by court until June 6th 1873. and no
Report made until Sept. - Dec. 1873.

2nd The record shows that Cattle Parks & Slegel
were appointed to view, and that the order
to view was issued to Cattle Parks & Wilson
and the view made by them.

3rd Because the whole proceeding is altogether
irregular and illegal.
