That a public
road hath been lately laid out by order
of Court from the corner of the garden
fence of A. Secoute on the Township road
leading from Clearfield to Frenchville, in
Girard Township, to the forks of the public
road near the house of Henry Bumbarger
in Bradford Township, and said road is
confirmed absolutely by your Honorable Court
will be very injurious and burdensome to
your petitioners, and to the inhabitants of
the said Township, through which the same
will pass, being altogether unnecessary and
unfit for public use, and being designed
only to benefit two or three individuals, and
being over very rough and hilly ground,
and not by any means as good and de-
sirable road as could have been laid out, even
if the same were necessary for public use,
and being such a route as will require an
immense cost to complete ready for use, your
petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court
that the same may not be confirmed absolutely, and they make no complete

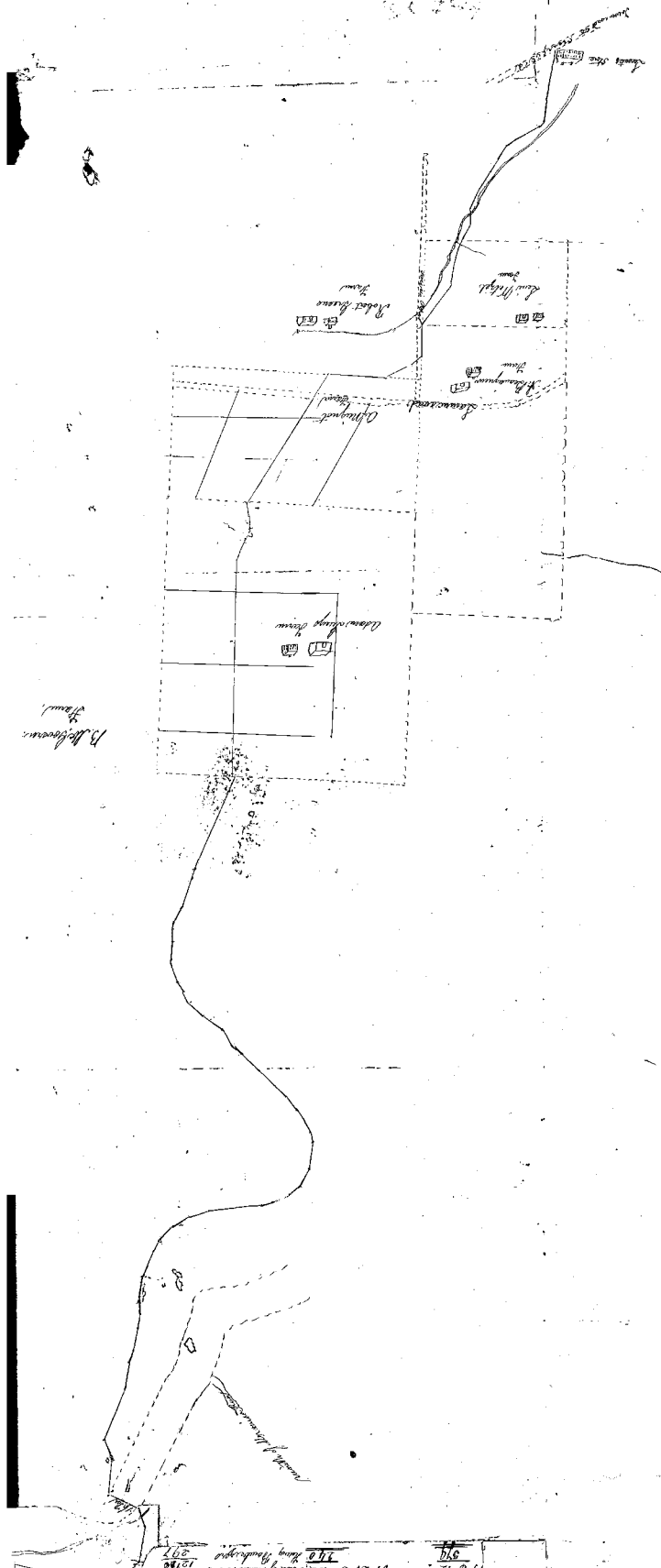
