# Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of September, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Houston, in said county, setting forth that <sup>M. B. Hewitt</sup> ~~they~~ labor under great inconvenience for the want of a <sup>Private</sup> road or highway, leading from his farm in Houston Town-  
ship, now occupied by John S. Burley to the public  
road leading to Mill Run -  
"Report as to Damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. Bird, Hiram Woodward and Elias Horning  
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for <sup>private</sup> said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

The undersigned appointed to view a  
Private Road for Wm B. Harvitt in Huston Township  
Respectfully Report.

After having given notice by posting three  
notices in public places - they met on the  
ground Oct. 2. 1873 and found that the said  
Road was needed - and proceeded to lay it  
out as follows.

Beginning 10 feet North of the Common Corner of the  
farm of Wm B. Harvitt - Samuel Lucore - Crayton Man-  
dle and John G. Reading - for center of this road -  
Thence S. 85° W. South eighty five degrees west  
Twenty one and two tenths rods to center of Pub-  
lic Highway - to Mill Run - 10 feet south of the  
Common line of said Lucore & Readings farms.

No damages were claimed by Samuel  
Lucore or John G. Reading - through  
whose improvements the road passes - and  
the road is laid 20 feet wide  
The views were sworn according to law  
before laying said road.
