CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 20th day of January, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the townships of Brady & Huston, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near Philip Gelnetto in Brady Township to ~~at or near~~ intersect the public Road at or near David Burkey's in Huston Township —

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

G. L. Kirk, M. H. Luther and John Kolder

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable The Judges of The Court of
Quarter Sessions of The Peace, in and for
Clearfield County: We the undersigned, appo-
inted by The annexed order do report; That in
pursuance thereof, all being present, and fir-
st severally sworn according to law, viewed the
ground proposed for the within mentioned road,
we do agree that there is occasion for a road as des-
ired by The petitioners, and that The same is nec-
essary for a public road. And having had respec-
t to The shortest distance and The best ground for
such road, we have laid out in such manner
as shall, in our opinion, do The least injury to
private property, and as far as practicable agreeably
to The desire of The petitioners, and do return for
public use The following described road, to wit:-
Beginning at a Red Oak, at public road near
David Burkeys, in Houston Township; Thence
South 6° East, through timber lands of Recording Dis-
ner & Co. Sixty two perches to a Post; Thence S. 11½° W.
Through lands of same, one hundred & seven perches
to a Red Oak, on lands of C. Burns; Thence S. 36° E. Six-
ty perches to a Post, in line of lands of John Duford;
Thence S. 27½° E. eighty nine perches to a Post; Thence
S. 12° W. Sixty three perches to a Hemlock; Thence S. 9° E.
forty four perches to a Beech; Thence S. 4½° W. nineteen
perches Hemlock; Thence S. 28½° W. twenty perches to
a Post; Thence S. 10½° W. Sixty perches to a Post; Thence S.
17½° W. Twenty three and a half perches to a Post; Thence

S. 9° E. forty six perches to a Maple Stump; Thence
S. 22° W. one hundred and sixty four perches to a He-
mlock, on lands of Fuller & Co.; Thence South,
Sixty two perches to a Post in Public road at Ph-
ilip's Gilnetts Barn. Said road being at an elev-
ation not exceeding five degrees. The undersigned
further report that we have made inquiry as to
damages, and find that no damages result to
any one through whose land said road passes.
We further report, that before The said view, pub-
lic notice of The time and place of The meeting
of The viewers was given by advertisements put up
at three of The most public places in The vic-
inity - Ten days before said meeting, and we

annex a Plot or draft of said road laid out,
stating the courses and distances, and noticing
briefly the improvements through which the same
passes.
