The Commonwealth of citizen of Chester and
Burnside Townships in said County respectfully
represent:

That a road has lately been laid out from
W. Westover in Chest Township to McKeig school
house in Burnside Township, which road
if confirmed will be very injurious to private
property and burthenome to the inhabitants of
said Township, for the following reasons: There is
already one Township road laid out through the
entire length of the farm of John Hips in Chest
Township. The road lately laid out runs nearly the
entire length of said Hips' farm and only twenty
rods distant from the other road. If said
road is confirmed it will cost the inhabitants
of said Township about fifteen hundred dollars
to open it. It is entirely unnecessary for the
commerce of the inhabitants of said Township.
Your Petitioners therefore pray Your Honors not to
confirm said road as they will ever pray etc.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26th day of Sept, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Chest & Burnside, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from public Road in Chest Township on land of Mr. Westover thence by nearest route to intersect a public road at or near McKee's School House in Burnside Township

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Mr. S. Boies, Henry Pentico and Mr. Westover

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
