Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 26 day of Sept, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Graham, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near the upper end of the Rafting ground opposite Sandy Run up to the mouth of Big Run and thence to intersect the Road leading from Deer Creek to Grahampton at or near Thos. Forcey's
"Report as to Damaged"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Levi Neubler S. F. McCloskey & Isaac Kyler
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

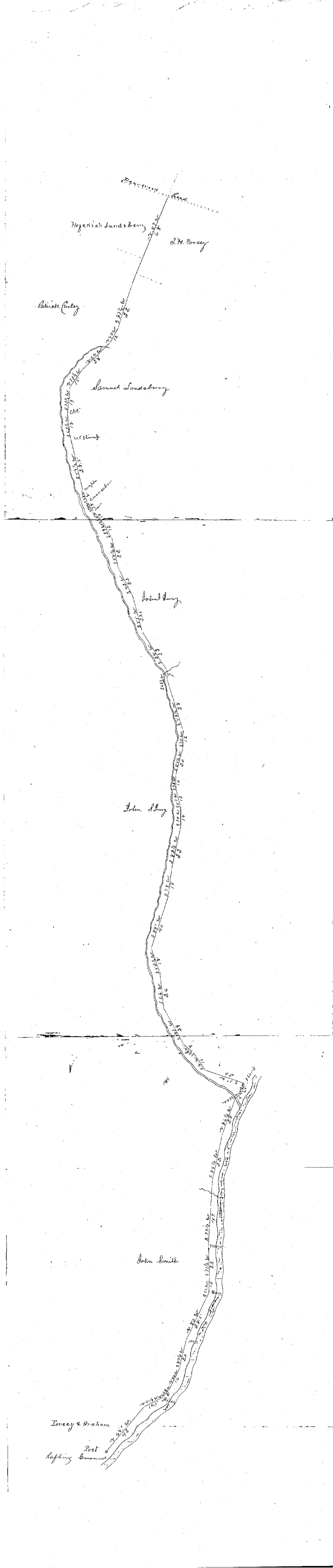

To the Hon Judges within named.

We, the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report: That after giving notice of the time and place of meeting according to the act of Assembly; and being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said road; and being all sworn or Affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order we have viewed, and laid out and do return the following road "to wit": Beginning at a Post at the upper end of the rafting ground, opposite the Mouth of Sandy Run, in Graham Township, on the South side of the Susquehanna River, thence through Land of Forcey & Graham, and up the River, North Sixty five Degrees, west, forty two perches, thence North forty one and a half Degrees west fourteen and five tenths perches to a Birch, North Sixty five and a half Degrees west, Eight perches North Eighty Degrees west, Sixteen perches, thence through Land of John Smith South Eighty seven and a half Degrees, East, Twenty perches to a Hemlock, North Eighty Degrees west, Thirty Eight and five tenths perches, to a Gum, South Seventy seven Degrees west, Ten perches, South seventy one and a half Degrees west, Twenty two perches to a Hemlock, South seventy seven and a half Degrees west, forty seven perches, South Eighty five and a half Degrees west, thirty two perches, North Eighty six and a half Degrees west, Twenty nine perches, North Fifty seven and a half Degrees west, Six perches, South Eighty seven and a half Degrees west, six and five tenths perches to a Stump, thence up the "Big Run" South one Degree west, Thirty perches, South Eighty Degrees west, Sixteen perches, South twenty four Degrees west, Eight perches, South forty three Degrees west, Twenty nine perches, South fifty six Degrees west, Twenty six perches, South fifty two and a half Degrees west, Eighteen perches, South Eighty nine Degrees west, forty perches, South seventy eight Degrees west, Eighteen perches, South Eighty three and a half Degrees west, thirty two perches, South seventy Degrees west, fourteen perches, South fifty seven Degrees west, fifteen perches, South seventy two Degrees west, ten perches, South Eighty five and a half Degrees west, twenty perches, thence through Land of John S. Burg, South seventy two Degrees west, twelve perches, South fifty three and a half Degrees west, thirty eight perches, South fifty eight and a half Degrees west, eleven perches, South thirty eight Degrees west, thirty three perches, South fifty five Degrees west, twenty seven and five tenths perches, South forty two Degrees west, twenty two perches, South fifty eight and a half Degrees west, twenty two perches, South thirty nine Degrees west, twelve perches, South twenty eight Degrees west, ten perches, to a Hemlock, South thirty eight Degrees west, seven and eight tenths perches, to a Quince, South forty eight Degrees west, eight perches to a Maple, South fifty seven and a half Degrees west, thirty eight and five tenths perches, to a white pine Stump, thence through Land of Patrick Curly, South fifty three and a half Degrees west, eighteen perches to a Chestnut, thence South seventy three and a half Degrees west, nineteen perches, South seventy three and a half Degrees west, fifteen perches, North Sixty four Degrees west, twenty eight perches, thence through Land of Samuel Sandebury, North Eighty Degrees west, twelve perches, thence South Eighty seven and a half Degrees west, thirty two perches to the line Sandebury and Patrick Curly, thence on their line North Eighty seven Degrees west, at Eight perches corner of Sandebury and Thomas H. Forcey, at twenty perches, corner of Curly and Hezekiah Sandebury, Sixty eight perches to the Bear Creek Road, near H. Forcey, a Draft whereof is herewith annexed, which said road as aforesaid laid out; we are of opinion is necessary for a public Road. So person or persons present.

Obtain any Damage by the aforesaid Road, and we are of opinion that it does no one any Damage.
