D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ^{change of} road or highway, leading from at or near the end of Jacob Snyder's lane to the public road at the north line of New Washington Borough

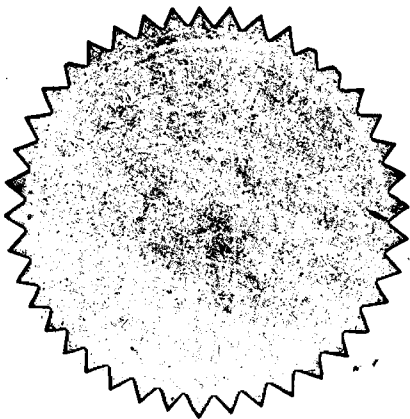
And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thos. W. Moore James Byers and Jas. Stevenson

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ^{change of} road, they shall proceed to lay out ^{vacate & supply} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

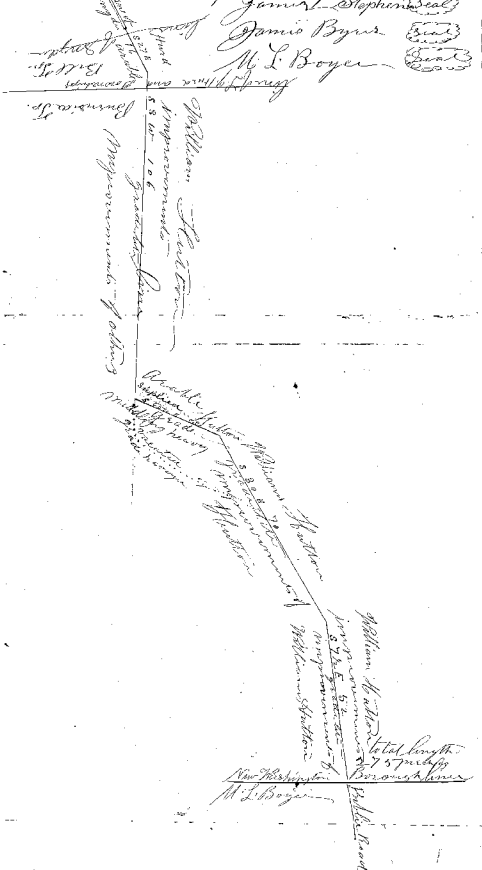

Of the Honorable the Judges with, advised
 that the persons appointed by annexed order
 of court to view and lay out the Road
 therein named do report: that in pursuance
 thereof after giving due and public notice
 according to law, having been duly
 sworn and affirmed all the viewers
 appointed by said order, having viewed
 the ground proposed for the within
 mentioned Road, and the undesignated
 viewers do agree there is occasion for a
 Road as desired by the petitioners and
 that the same is for a public Road and
 having had respect to the shortest
 distance and best ground for such
 Road we have laid it out in such a
 manner as should do the least injury
 to private property and as far as practicable
 agreeably to the desires of the petitioners
 vacating and supplying parts of previous
 view and do return for public use the
 following described Road commencing
 at the mouth of West Digges Lane in
 Ball Township thence by a straight line of
 the same South twenty seven Digges East.
 Thence through the same course through
 arable lands of S. J. Ward thirteen perches
 thence through the same South three Digges
 west five perches to the township line of
 Ball and Burnside thence by line of William
 Hutton and others the same course one
 hundred and one perches gradeable by
 improvement thence through the

arable lands of William Hutton South
 sixty five and a half Digges East
 gradeable having thirty one perches
 thence through the improvement of
 William Hutton gradeable to
 South thirty Digges East seventy
 perches thence thence by same South
 seven and a half Digges East fifty
 two perches gradeable to New Washington
 Borough line entire length two
 hundred and seventy five perches
 A plot or draft whereof is hereunto
 annexed which said Road so as afore
 said laid out vacated and supplied
 we are of the opinion is necessary for a
 public Road and we assess the damages
 to be none. Witness our hands & seals
