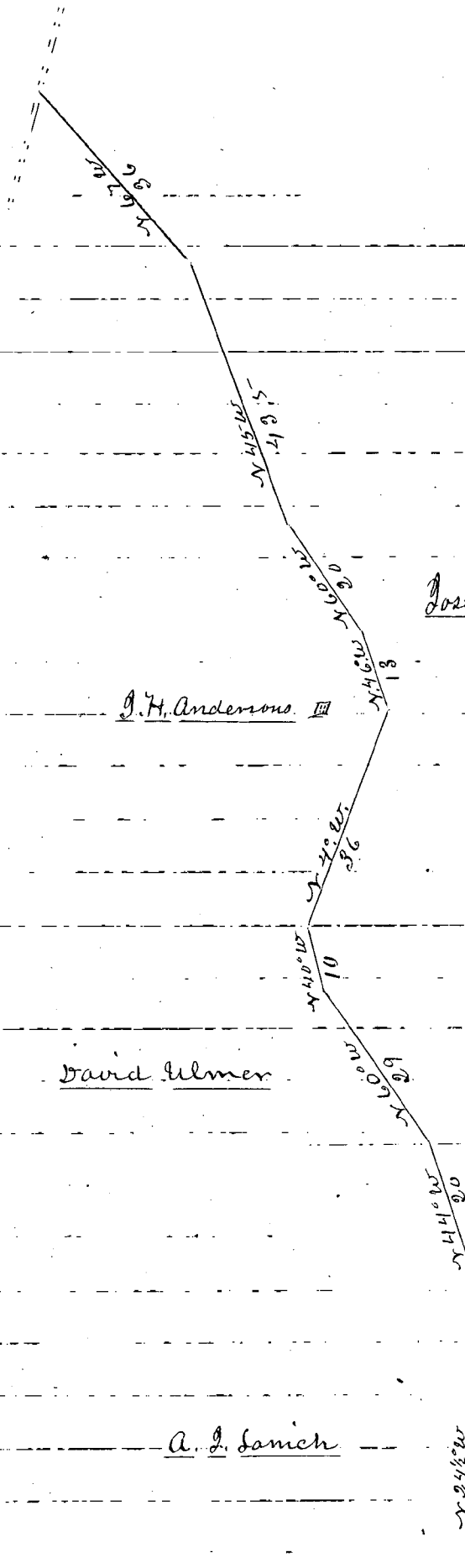

Report: That having given notice of the time and place of meeting,

And being all present at the view of the ground proposed
for the said Road, and having all been sworn or affirmed
in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and
laid out; And do return the following Road viz
Beginning at the Public Road on the line between Joseph
Bailey & Mrs Smeals land, Thence on their line South Sixty
five and a half degrees west, Eighty six perches to the line of
said Bailey and A J Sanich, Thence on their line North twenty
four and a half degrees west, Forty nine perches, Thence through
land of the said Sanich and land of David Wilmer, North forty four
degrees west, Twenty perches, North Sixty degrees west Twenty
nine perches, North forty degrees west Ten perches, North
four degrees west, Thirty six perches, North forty six degrees
west, Thirteen perches, North Sixty degrees west, Twenty perches
North Forty four degrees west, Forty three and five tenths perches
North Sixty seven degrees west, Thirty six perches to an old Road,
which said Road as aforesaid laid out we are of opinion
is necessary for a Public Road. A Draft whereof is here-
unto annexed. And we further agree that no one is entitled
to any damage in consequence of the above described Road

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 21st day of April, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near John St. Anderson's place to at or near Jackson Canich in Pike Township

Report as to Damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. L. McCloskey — John Morris and Caleb Hay ~~James Dresser~~

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
