To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Dearfield.

Your petitioners further represent that they verily believe that the road or way now used to reach Houtzdale after leaving the road from Houtzdale to Puseyville was never laid out or located as a public road or highway and that the same is inconvenient and dangerous and will become burdensome if not already so.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the road pray

# Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 7 day of June, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Woodward, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from the corner of Brisbaw and Mary Streets in the Borough of Houtzdale to intersect the private Public road leading from Houtzdale to Puseyville about  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile from Houtzdale

Report as to damages &c  
and vacate the old road so far as supplied by  
the view of the said road

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according

to law. Wherupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thos W. Moore, Jacob F. Steiner & Rich, Houghs

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
