Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Seventh day of June, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Penn, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from the Public Road at Dan, McEwens to a public road leading from the Lake at Danvers farm to Tenton and Spencers Saw mill "Report as to Damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thos. W. Moore — W. T. Sharp And Allen McDonald

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the foregoing order of Court to view the road therein described after having first been duly affirmed according to Law. Do Report that in pursuance of said appointment after having first given due notice of the same by advertisements put up of the time & place of said view, and also having required as to damages resulting to any one by reason of the passing of said road, have ascertained that no damage results to any one. We have viewed laid out and do return for Public use the following road viz— Beginning at a Post on the Public road near Danl M^r Ewers thence North 61 degrees west 22 Perches to a Post North $7\frac{3}{4}$ degrees East 24.2 Perches to a Post North 27 degrees East 104 Perches to a Post on line of Arnold Hartshorn & Cos land, Thence by the same North 87 degrees West 109.5 Perches to a Post corner of Abram Myrles land and on Public road leading from the Pike at Danville to Arnold & Hartshorn & Cos Sawmill.

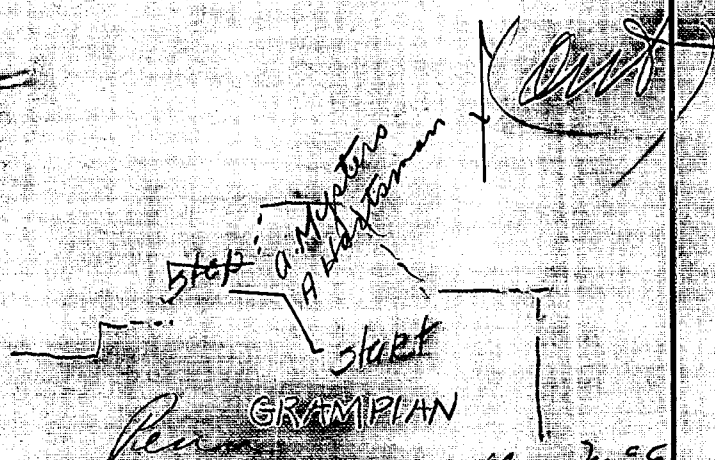
