Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 23 day of November, A. D. 1872, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from on account of public road long since laid out, beginning at a point in public road leading from Lamborn to Adams Mill at or near the premises of Joel L. Forrest, and intersecting the Erie and Waterford ^{turnpike} at the village of Stoneyville.

Report as to damages &c
for fit the road running from ^{in the fall of} Burton Merat, Samuel Stott & William Gallagher

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Burton Merat, Samuel Stott and William Gallagher

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is no occasion for such road, they shall proceed to vacate the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same vacation of necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
