CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Seventh day of June, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell & Chest, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road~~^{change} of highway, leading from at or near William Mahaffey's in Bell Township to L. J. Hurds in Chest Township

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

E. S. Miller — Austin Curry & John H. Bell with power to review — vacate and supply the same

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the persons appointed to review the road within mentioned, and parts adjacent do report: That after being severally affirmed according to law, that in pursuance of the said order we did review the same, and have laid out for public use the following road to wit; beginning on the bank of Snyder run near Wm. Mahaffey's thence ~~South~~ forty three deg. East twenty eight perches; thence South fifty four deg. East sixty six perches thence, South sixty two deg. East sixteen perches. - along old road, thence South forty six deg. East seven perches off the old road, thence South fifty eight deg. & eight perches and come on old road, thence South fifty eight deg. East, ten perches and along old road, thence: To y old road, South seventy three deg. East eighteen perches, thence South sixty six deg. East thirty five perches, thence South forty nine deg. East seventy four perches through lower premises of Jacob C. Snyder, thence South fifty three deg. East sixteen perches, thence South sixty four deg. East six perches to where we evacuated the ballance of the road and supplied it as follows South twenty two deg. East fifteen perches thence South fifteen deg.
