To The Honorable Judges of The Quar-
ter Sessions Court of Clearfield Co. The
Grand Jury, and Commissioners of said County.

The undersigned citizens respect-
fully but firmly reiterate against
the erection of a Bridge across the
Susquehanna River at or near the
Mouth of Sandy Run in Corrington
Township, (as proposed by the petition
of citizens and Report of viewers for
that purpose,) for the following rea-
sons:

First; A Bridge at that point is not
needed by the public. The amount of
travel and business there would not by
any means justify the expenditure which
the erection of a bridge would require.

Secondly, In the long distance between
Clearfield and Harthaus there are no
bridges across the River, and we believe
the first Bridge which the County assists
in the erection of, between these points, ~~and~~
be at some ~~place~~ where it is most needed.

Thirdly, A Bridge at Sandy would be
three times as far from Clearfield as
it would be from Harthaus, and as a
result of this location, would accom-
modate less than half the number of
persons which a Bridge midway between
Clearfield and Harthaus would accom-
modate.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Fifth day of June, A. D. 1873, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Covington & others, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway~~, leading from Bridge across the Susquehanna River at or near the Mouth of Sandy Run in Covington Township

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to the Laws provided for the erection of County Bridge to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Charles Schnarrs, John Moulson & Jacob Wilhelm who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said Bridge; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such Bridge, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a Bridge, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private Bridge, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

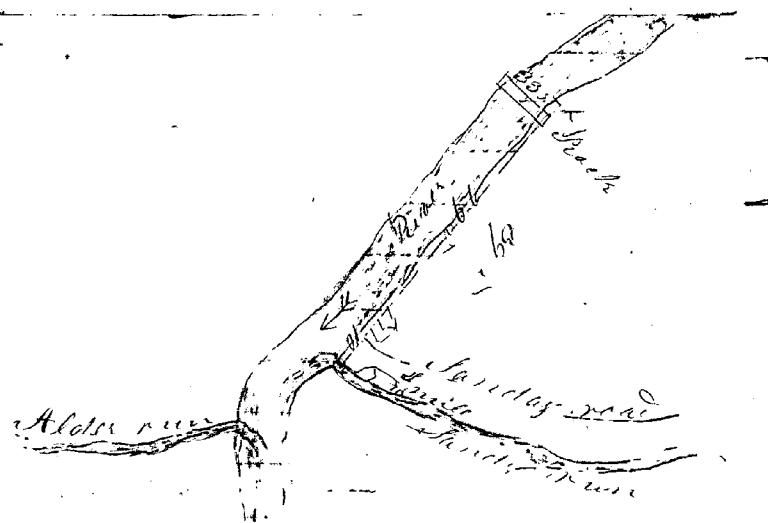
