Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the ninth day of October, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Covington, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ^{change of} road or highway, leading from the Susquehanna River at or near Deer Creek to where it intersects the public road leading from Clearfield to Karthaus

Report as to damages re

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Fredk Mignot Francisoudrieth and John Picard

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ^{change of} road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ^{change of} road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

of Quarter Sessions of Cleonfeld
County. The petition of the undersigned
inhabitants of Cornington Township
respectfully represents:
That a public
road has long since been laid
out by order of your honorable
Court from at or near the
Susquehanna River at Newbold
to intersect the public road leading
from Cleonfeld Town to Korthaus
on land of Francis Seigey. Which
road or part of road to wit that
part leading from where it intersects
the Cleonfeld and Korthaus ^{road} to a point
near the Susquehanna River when it
intersects line of Francis Seigey has become
inconvenient and burdensome and could
be greatly improved with respect to grade
distance and damage to private property
by changing the course thereof so as
to begin at a point on road from
Cleonfeld to Korthaus at or near the
line dividing the property of Francis
Seigey and Gordon Condit and to
intersect the old road nearer the Sus
quehanna River at a point at or near
where old road intersects the line of
Francis Seigey. They therefore
