Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 17 day of March, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs; in said county, setting forth that ~~they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a~~ ^a road or highway, leading from Abraham Litz's ford ^{to Wilson Hoover's Bridge in Boggs Township} ~~has become very burthensome and useless~~

And, therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. H. McLoskey, John Beish and Wm. Gallaher

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there ^{is} ~~is~~ occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

We the undersigned persons, appointed by the
within Order of Court, to view, and vacate the Road
therein mentioned. Respectfully report: That, having
given notice, of the time and place of meeting, according
to the Act of Assembly, and being all present at the
view of the ground proposed for said vacation, and
being all sworn or Affirmed, in pursuance of the said
Order, we have viewed the ground proposed for the said
Road, and find that it would be very expensive to make, and
a great burthen upon the Township. and further that
the said proposed Road, as laid out is not necessary.
We therefore declare it vacated. Described as follows.
Beginning at the Public Road, at Lily's fording on the East side
of Clearfield Creek. Thence down the Creek. and Through land
said to be of Uriah Lily. North fifty nine degrees East, Seventeen
perches, North forty eight degrees East, sixteen perches, North thirty
five and a half degrees East, Four and seven tenths perches, North
thirty degrees East, fourteen perches, North twenty degrees East,
ten perches, North ten degrees East, twenty perches, North sixteen
perches, North fourteen degrees West, thirteen perches, North fifteen
degrees West, five and five tenths perches, North twenty four degrees
West, thirteen perches, North thirty degrees West, twenty five
perches, North forty degrees West, forty three perches, North twenty
degrees (East Through land of Wilson Hoover) Twenty three and
five tenths perches to the Public Road at Wilson Hoovers
