Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the eighth day of June, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Union, in said county, setting forth that ~~they labor under great inconvenience~~ ^{a certain} ~~for the want of a~~ road or highway, leading from W. W. Houlap's land

to new road leading from Bloorn Township
has become useless, inconvenient and burthen
some to the inhabitants of said Township

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J. H. Moore, David Melly and John Brubaker

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{vacation} and if any two of them agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ ^{vacate} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

for the County of Clearfield. We the undersigned
viewers appointed by the foregoing Order of said
Court to vacate the road therein described.
Do Report that after having first given due notice
by partly written & partly printed advertisements
put up according to Law of the time & place of
said vacation and having been duly affirmed
we all proceeded to view said road and va-
cate the same by the following courses & distances
To wit - Beginning at Mr. W. Dunlaps Lane thence
by line of said Dunlap South 56 Perches thence
South 15 Degrees East. 46 Perches thence South
5 Degrees East. 16 Perches thence South 114 Perches
thence South 9 Degrees East 18 Perches South 34
Degrees East. 14 Perches South 83 Degrees East 7
Perches to New Road leading to Bloom Township
as said road having never been opened in our
opinion should be vacated. A Plan & Draft of which
