The petition of the undersigned inhab-
itants of the Township of Brady, in
the said County, humbly sheweth,

That a road has been lately laid out
by order of the Court from, at or near,
Eliza Ashenfelters To the Pumberg
Schoolhouse, which road, if confirmed
by the Court, will not be the nearest nor
best route To the Station at the Rail Road,
compelling the Travelling Community to
Travel from one half to three fourths of
a mile farther in going from the Pike
To the Railroad and accommodating no one
that is not now accommodated by a
public Road. Whereas by vacating that
part of the Road from To the
Schoolhouse and relocating it on the east
side of the Pumberg Run To the public
road at Mrs. Coustings and in a direct
line with a street leading To the R.R. Station,
it then will accommodate several settlers
that has no public Road To their Residence
and will be on ground equally good and short

in the distance as above stated;

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, ~~having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property;~~ and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
