To the Honorable Judges of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of Pike and Lawrence Townships respectfully represents:

That a road has lately been laid out and opened by order of your honorable court from at or near Joseph Marshburne in Lawrence Township, to at or near Benjamin Carr's place in Pike Township, and that part of said road built that part of said road which leads from Joseph Marshburne's house aforesaid to the intersection of said road with road leading from John Hancock's to Hugh Mullin's place has become inconvenient and burdensome and could be greatly improved by the respect wth grade, distance, and damage to private property by slightly clearing.

The course thereof, they therefore pray your Honor's to appoint viewers to view said premises with power to cut all dead supply, and make return thereof to your honorable court, and they will ever pray etc.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of June, A. D. 1874; before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ^{change of} road or highway, leading from Joseph Marshalls in Lawrence Sp. to Ben. Larns farm in Pike Sp. - being that part thereof between Joseph Marshalls place and the intersection of said road with road leading from John Stan-cocks to Hugh Mullen -

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ^{vacate and supply} lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Inv S. Cuttle I. S. McPherson Alv. Antes

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of Clearfield.

The undersigned viewers appointed by your Honors in and by virtue of the order hereto annexed, to view, supply, and vacate, a portion of the road leading from Joseph Marshall's and the intersection of said road with the road leading from John Hancock's to Hugh Miller's in Pike Township. Respectfully report, that having given due, timely, and legal notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, and being first duly affirmed, proceeded to view the ground proposed to be changed, and have laid out and to now return for public use the following road, Beginning at a Post in old road, thence $5\frac{3}{4}\frac{1}{2}$ ten perches, $5\frac{7}{8}\frac{1}{2}$ eight perches, to a Post at angle of old road, and also from the point between the $5\frac{3}{4}\frac{1}{2}$ 10 & $5\frac{7}{8}\frac{1}{2}$ 8 per. $5\frac{1}{2}$ 10. to Hugh Muller Road, ^{2 perches} and return the old road from its intersection with the Muller Road which bears $5\frac{5}{8}$ seventeen perches in length for vacating. and we further state for the information of the Court that said change of road will enable persons to connect conveniently with the Muller Road which could not be done with the old arrangement, and we consider said change to be necessary, a Plot or draught of which is hereto annexed. All which is respectfully submitted.


