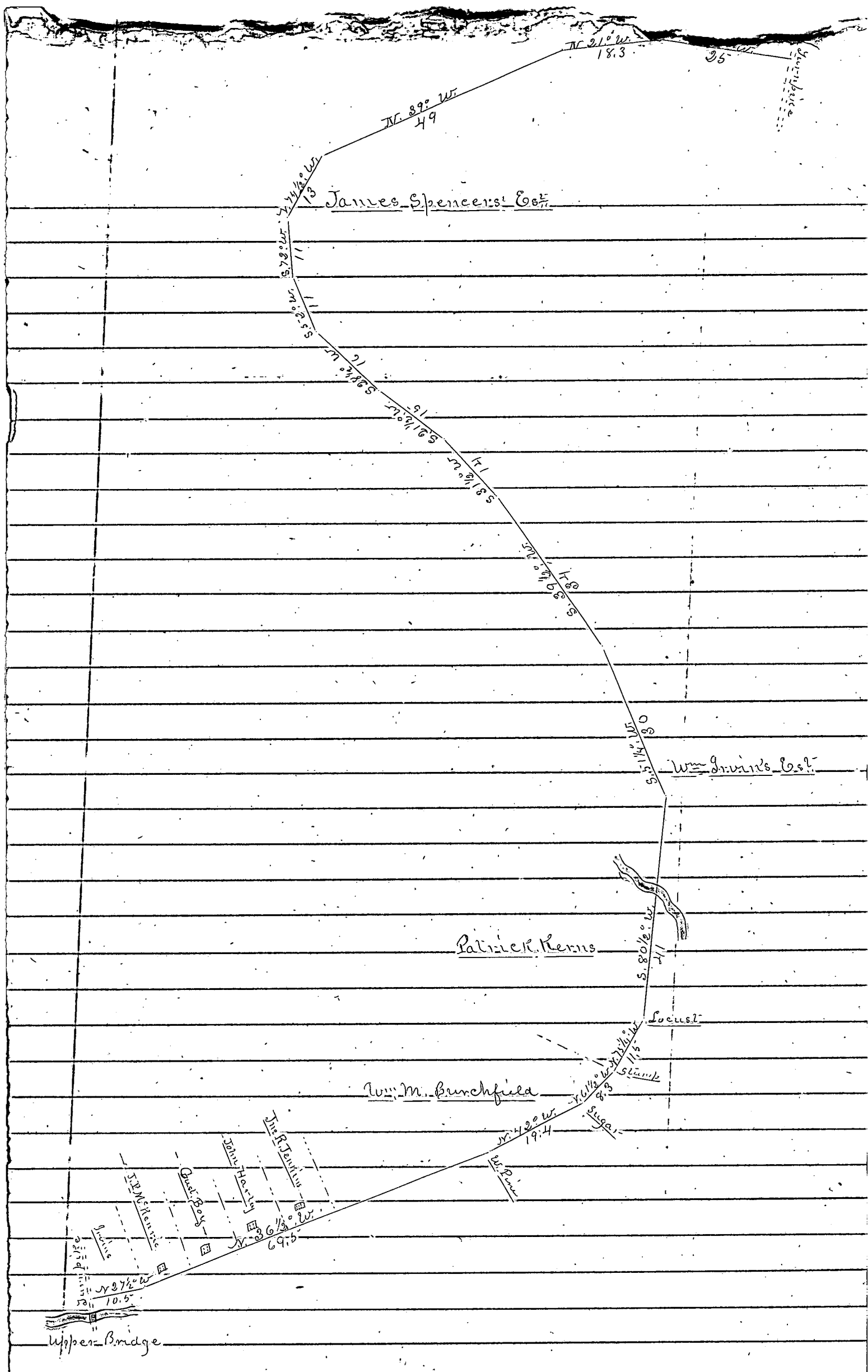

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned, Respectfully report that having given notice of the time and place of meeting according to the act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said road, and being all sworn or affirmed in pursuance of the said Order of Court we have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following Road viz Beginning in the Turnpike at the upper Anderson Creek Bridge, Thence in front of Lots of J. H. McKenric, - Gust Boy, John Harley, John R. Jenkins, - land of Rev. Wm. M. Burchfield North twenty seven and a half degrees west, - Ten and five tenths perches, Thence North thirty six and a half degrees west, - Sixty nine and five tenths perches to a white pine, Thence North forty two degrees west, - nineteen and four tenths perches to a Sugar, Thence North sixty one and a half degrees west, - Eight and three tenths perches to a stump, Thence through land of Patrick Kerns, North seventy five and a quarter degrees west, - Eleven and five tenths perches to a Locust, South eighty and a half degrees west, - forty one perches, Thence through Wm. Irvin's Estate South fifty one and a quarter degrees west, - thirty perches, South thirty nine and a half degrees west, - thirty four perches, South thirty one and a half degrees west, - fourteen perches, South twenty one and a half west, - fifteen perches, South twenty eight and a half degrees west, - sixteen perches, South fifty two degrees west, - eleven perches, South seventy two degrees west, - eleven perches, North seventy four and a half degrees west, - thirteen perches, North thirty nine degrees west, - forty nine perches, North nine degrees west, - twenty five perches To the Turnpike at Bridge port. Which said Road as aforesaid laid out, we are of opinion is necessary for a Public Road, and we are of opinion further that no parties are entitled to any damage in consequence of the aforesaid laid out road.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the third day of October, A. D. 1874; before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from the upper Bridge

across Anderson Creek at Crowsville to the
Village of Bridgeport

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Sam F. McCloskey, Ben Hartshorn Sr, and Johnston Holden

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
