We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned respectfully report - That having given notice of the time and place of meeting, according to the act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the ground proposed for the said road, and being all sworn or affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and laid out, and do return the following course, viz: Beginning at a point in the public road, by two marked Stumps, near Mitchell & Merritts Saw Mill in Boggs, Township. Thence through Land of Mitchell & Merritt South thirty five degrees East - twenty perches (20) South three degrees West: nine perches (9) South Twenty six degrees West: Twenty perches (20) South thirty four and a half degrees West Eleven perches (11) South 22 degrees West Twenty two and five tenths perches (22.5) South 22 degrees West forty four perches (44) South Twelve degrees East: Twenty Eight perches (28) South six and a half degrees East: twelve perches (12) South eighteen degrees West - forty one and five tenths perches (41.5) South twenty one degrees West - fifty six perches (56) South four degrees West: Eighteen perches (18) South four and a half degrees East - Eight perches (8) South eighteen and a half degrees West Seven perches (7) to a lot of South One degree East Thirteen perches (13) South Thirteen degrees West Six perches (6) South seven degrees East Nineteen and a half perches (19.5) South, Seven and five tenths perches (7.5) South fourteen degrees West - Thirty two perches (32) South sixty four degrees West fifty Eight perches (58) South forty four degrees West fifty two perches (52) to the public Road near Alexander Dixons. A draft whereof is hereunto Annexed which said road as aforesaid laid out we are of opinion S. F. W. Clossy is necessary for public use. No damage is claimed John Coulter Viewers

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13th day of June, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Boggs, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from at or near Mitchells and Merrets Saw Mill to intersect Township Road at leading from Alex. Dixons to the Lamborn Bridge

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey, Jno Coulter and Thos. Beers

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
