ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the Eighth day of June, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Houston, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from a point on the Hickory Kingdom road at or near the mouth of Heath run to Winterburn station or near the same on the Alleghany Valley Rail Road

Report as to damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. Bird - H. Woodward & C. Robacker who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

For the owner of Public Road in Huston
Township in ~~same~~ County from Hatch Run
to Winterburn - He would report -

He has been sworn according to law.
He views the premises on July 27, 1874.
He believes there is ~~necessity~~ & sufficient
cause for ^{public} a road and recommends
that it be granted as follows.

Begins at the Hickory Kingdom or Summit
Road a few rods southward from Hatch
Run - Thence (S. 21° E.) south twenty one
degrees east one hundred paces.

Thence (S. 12 1/2° E.) south twelve & a half
degrees east twenty six paces to a
point 4 paces from Rail Road, and about
4 paces west of South for Huston. to a
Shrub & stump. The road passes through
no improvements & there is no claim
for damages.
