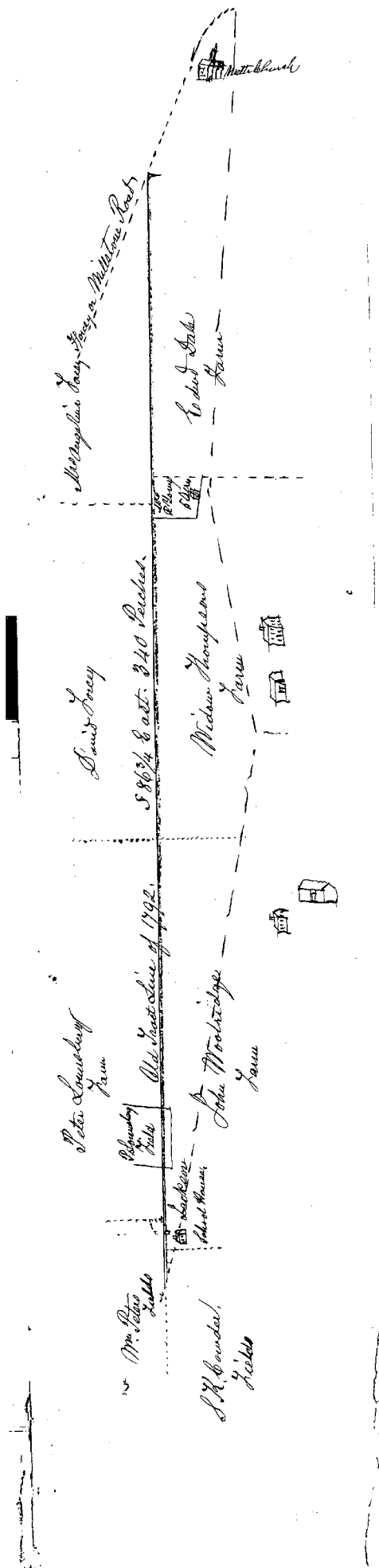

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the
County of Clearfield.

The undersigned viewers duly appointed
in and by virtue of the Order of Court hereto attached,
Respectfully Reports.

That after giving due, timely and
legal notice of the time and place of the meeting of the
viewers, by advertisements posted in public places in said
Township of Bradford, for more than five days previous to
making the view, they all met upon the ground proposed
for said road, and having first duly sworn or affirmed ac-
cording to law, to perform their duty with impartiality and
fidelity, proceeded to lay out and now do return for Public
use the following road, Beginning at the Township road
near "Jackson School House" where the old "Tract Line"
crosses said road, thence South eighty seven and one half
degrees East between Tracts surveyed in name of Charles
Pettit and William D. Kirwan on the North and Andrew
Pettit and John Nicholson on the South, Three Hundred
and forty perches to the "Forney Road" near the "Methodist
Episcopal Church" which we consider necessary, and
which road when made will enable the township to vacate
the old road, as the new view is on much better & drier
ground, lighter grade and shorter distance.

At Damages assessed as the view is laid on the original
tract line of 1792. All which is respectfully submitted.

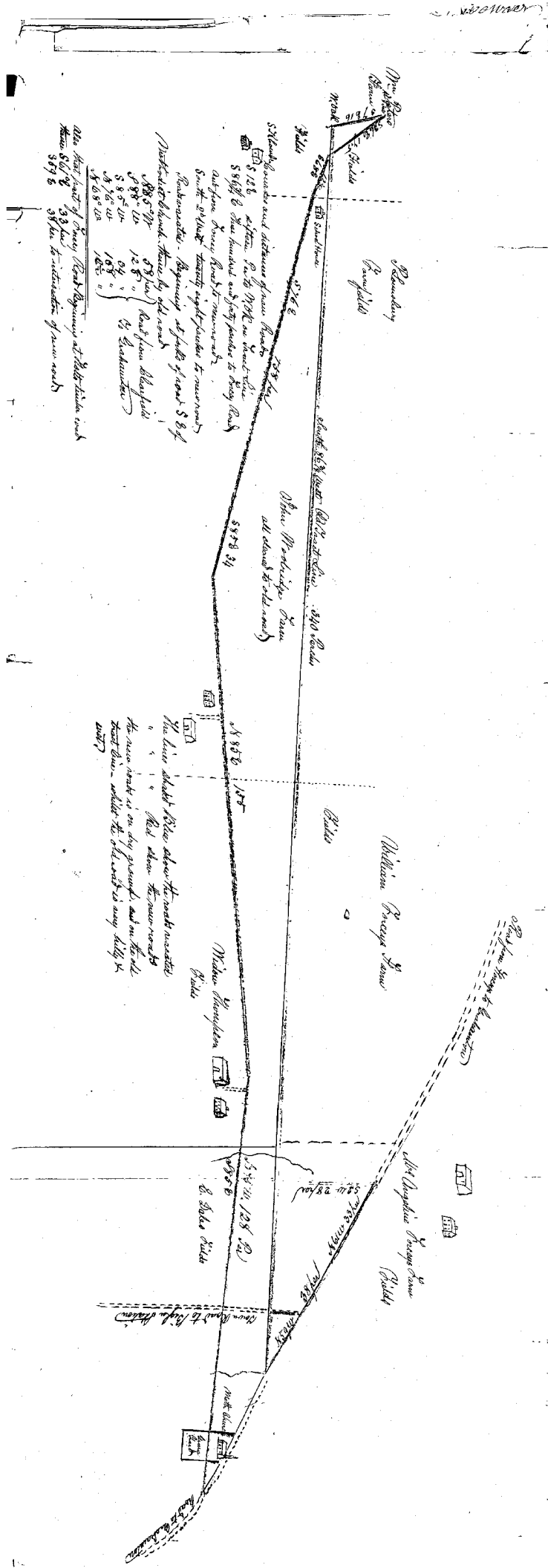

The undersigned viewers appointed in and by virtue of
the order hereto annexed Respectfully Report,

That they met upon the ground
proposed for said road, and the parts of roads for vacation, and having
been first duly sworn according to law to perform the required duties
proceeded to lay out the road as petitioned for on the Tract Line between
the Andrew and Charles Pettit, and tracts in name of John Nicholson and
Mrs. S. Kirwan, beginning at a White Pine on edge of Township Road, thence
South 12° East fifteen perches to a White Oak on Tract line thence South
Eighty six $\frac{3}{4}$ degrees East Three Hundred and forty perches to Forey Road, and
which we return for Public use, and consider the same necessary, and we also have
laid out the following road beginning at a Post, at the timber road known as the
Holt timber road on the Forey Road, and ran South two degrees West twenty eight
perches and intersected the road laid out as above described, and which we consider
necessary, And we recommend for vacation the following roads, Beginning at the Holt
Timber Road on the Forey Road, thence South fifty one ^{degrees} East thirty three perches, and
South fifty nine degrees East to intersection of new Road as laid out above, then began to
lay out for vacation the road formerly used and known as the Grahamton & Clearfield Road
where it leads from the Forey Road South East of the Methodist Church, thence by old Road
North Eighty five degrees West fifty eight perches to David Forey Road, South Eighty eight
degrees West one hundred and twenty eight perches, South eighty five degrees West thirty four
perches, North seventy six degrees West one hundred and fifty eight perches, & North
sixty eight West, twelve & one half perches to intersection of the new road, and which we

Exception to view of Road returned
to Sept Session AD. 1875. leading from
Wm Peter farm to Public Road near Church
in Bradford Township.

1. The report does not show that notice
was given of the time & place of meeting
of viewers.
2. Only two of the viewers sign the report,
and the report does not state that the
other viewer was on the ground, or
viewed the Road.
3. The Road runs nearly parallel with
the old Road which is proposed to
be vacated, and a change is unneces-
sary as the old Road does accom-
modate the public just as well.
4. The new Road passes through cleared
land, not only imposing a large ex-
pense on the Township for making it,
but cutting up fields that it passes through
and subjecting the owner to heavy
expense in fencing &c.
5. The viewers have not considered the
question of damage, or made any

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the *Eighth* day of *June*, A. D. 1874, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Bradford*, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from *the Jackson schoolhouse to the M & E Church vacated and another supplied to run from the Jackson School house on the Tract line to intersect the Horsey Road near the M & E Church also part of the Horsey Road*

Report & Damages

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Mitchell *Sam'l Lowder* *W. H. Shirey*

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
