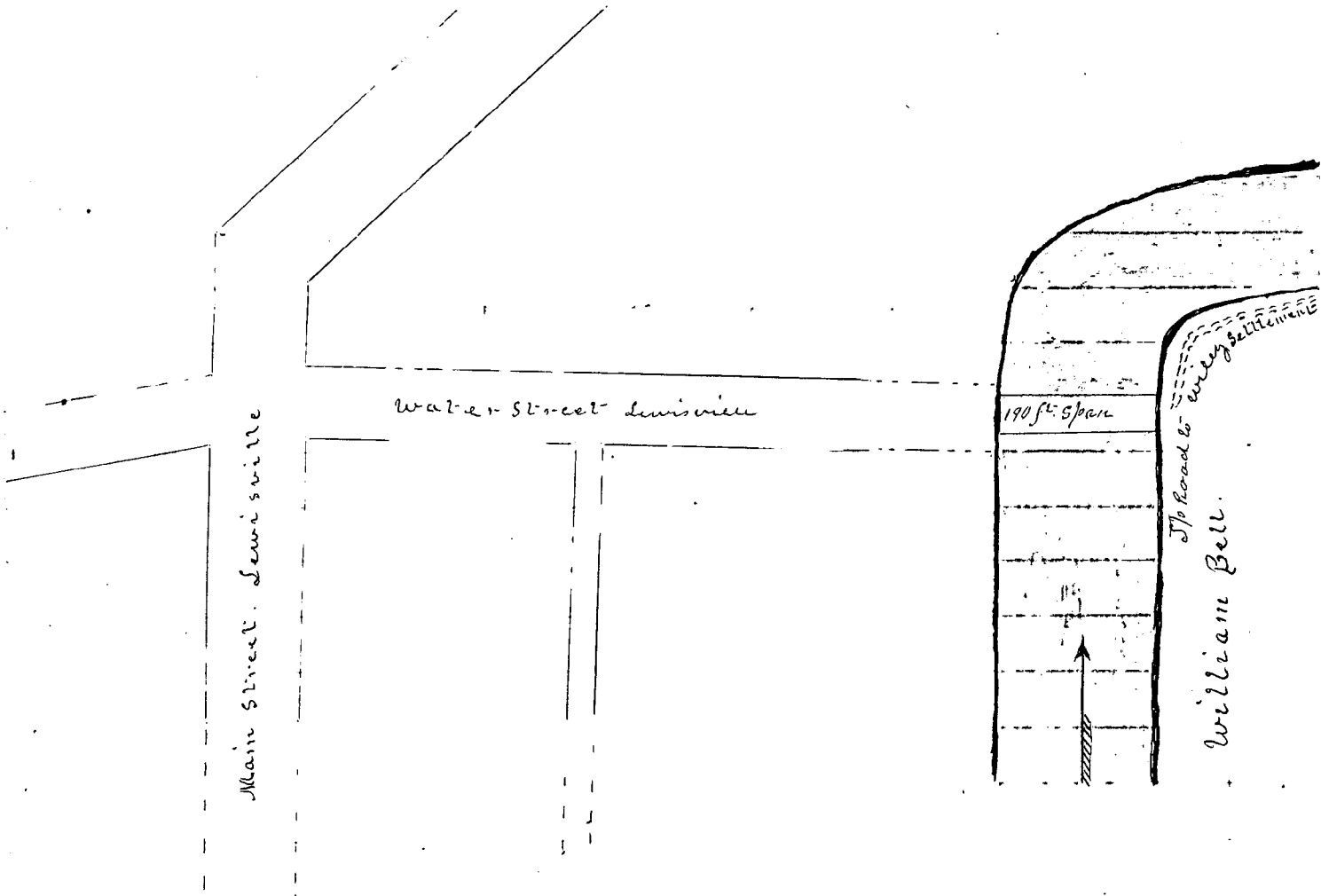
We The undersigned persons appointed by the
within order of Court to view and report
as to the necessity of erecting a Bridge across
The Susquehanna River at or near where
The public road crosses said River at Lewis-
ville in Greenwood Township Clearfield Co Pa,
do Respectfully report,

That having given
due and legal notice of the time and
place of meeting according to law, and
being all present at the view of the site
proposed for said Bridge, and being all sworn
or affirmed in pursuance of the said or-
der we have viewed the site proposed for
said Bridge, and find that a bridge at that
point would accommodate a great deal of trav-
el, and we think such a bridge is necessary.

and further the expense of erecting said
Bridge would be about ~~Six~~ *Six thousand five*
~~Hundred~~ - dollars, as we estimate
after careful examination and it
would be a greater expense than could
be reasonably be borne by said Town-
ship either alone, or with the assistance
of any adjoining township, and we there-
fore recommend that the County assist
therein. The ford at that point
is frequently rendered impassable by
reason of Ice and high water, and
we hereby refer our draft and

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 14th day of June, A. D. 1875, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Greenwood, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ~~road or highway~~ ^{Bridge} leading from ~~a~~ ^{across} Susquehanna River at the place where the public Highway crosses the River at Lewisville said Township, and that the expense of erecting the same would be too heavy on the inhabitants of said Township,

And the said viewers are also to inquire whether the expense of erecting said Bridge will be greater than can be reasonably borne by said Township.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and ~~lay out~~ ^{Report} the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

S. F. McCloskey Henry Swan and Thos. N. Moore

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said ~~road~~ ^{Bridge}; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ~~road~~ ^{Bridge}, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a ~~road~~ ^{Bridge}, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private ~~road~~ ^{Bridge}, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
