To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Cleaveland County now composing a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for said County.

The Petitioners of divers inhabitants of the township of Brady in said County humbly sheweth;

That three different roads have been laid out and opened by order of the Court in three different directions from a certain Sawmill in Brady township formerly owned by Frederic Zeigler but now the property of McClure & Yohe. One road running west from said Sawmill to Troutville and to Grist mill, another road running North to Luthersburg and Pleasantway Turnpike, and another road running East to Coal Hill road at Frederic Zeigler's; and that said roads, or at least the road running East from said Sawmill was not connected with the roads running North and West from said Sawmill by a distance of about ten rods; and moreover - said McClure & Yohe within the last 100 years or so have rebuilt and enlarged their Sawmill so as to partly interfere with passing along between the said Sawmill and the dam or weir, from public road on the East to public road leading to the North and west; and also more recently, by reason of a gate put across the passage, or way between said Sawmill and the dam or weir, (the only passage there) firmly locked or bolted so as to prevent all your petitioners from driving or riding along East or west past said Sawmill, from one public road to the other.

Your Petitioners therefore respectfully pray your Honor to appoint proper ^{persons} to review the said Road or Roads from Public Road running West from Sawmill of McClure & Yohe to the ~~road~~ of said Frederic Zeigler's; East to Public Road leading from David Risam Sawmill to Coal Hill Road with power to locate and supply and with instructions to report to the Court according to law. And they will ever Pray, &c.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of
Quarter Sessions of Clearfield County.

We the undersigned reviewers appointed
by the annexed order of Court to review vacate
and supply a road from line of lands of Frederick
Kear to Public Road leading North from David
Reams Sawmill respectfully report:--

That having given due and public notice
of the time and place of meeting for said review
by printed handbills as required by act of assembly
we met at the time and place appointed, and
after being duly sworn according to law and all
the viewers being present we went upon the ground
proposed for said review and having carefully
viewed the same we report for Public use the
following road to wit:-- Beginning at a Post
in Public Road North of David Reams Sawmill;
Thence through improved lands of David Reams and
wood lands of McChuse & Yoke West 22 perches to a Beech
Thence through said wood lands South $64\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West
 $30\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a Maple on line of Pub. Road to Geo. Hat-
fields; Thence North $54\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 34 per. to a post;
Thence North 88 deg. West 12 per. to a Hemlock tree;
Thence North $78\frac{1}{2}$ deg. West 22 per. to a Hemlock tree;
Thence across the creek North 40 deg. West $11\frac{1}{2}$ per. to Beech;
Thence North 84 deg. West 26 per. to a post in old road
Thence on line of said Public Road which is opened on
the best ground South $59\frac{1}{4}$ deg. West 12 per. to Post;
Thence by said Road South 36 deg. West 40 per. to Hemlock
Thence by same South 47 deg. West 20 per. to a post;
Thence by same South 22 deg. West 48 per. to a post;
Thence still by same Road South 12 per. to Hemlock
and $2\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a post on East Bank of Mahoning creek.

Thence by a new route South 48 deg. W. 6½ per. to a post on the west Bank of the creek at the foot of a hill; Thence along the foot of said hill South 3½ deg. West 11½ per. to a post; Thence by same South 15 deg. West 12 per. to a post; Thence by same South 38½ deg. West 12½ per. to a Maple; Thence by same South 45 deg. West 15 per. to a post; Thence by same South 49 deg. West 9 per. to intersect the public road which runs North from the Sawmill of McClure & Yohe past Erastus Luthers; Thence by the same Road which is opened South 25 deg. East on the Breast of the dam 10 per. to a stone at the Board yard; Thence by said Road and lumber yard South 30 deg. West 8 per. to post; Thence by public Road leading to Troutville South 89 deg. West 40 per. to a chestnut; Thence by same Road North 86½ deg. West 20 per. to post on line of land of Frederic Komar.

Thence from the stone on the breast of the dam at the lumber yard there is a private road over the breast of the dam past the Sawmill which was never laid out by any viewers nor never opened or worked upon by the public and which is the only way so far had of crossing from the public Roads on the East of said Sawmill of McClure & Yohe to the public Roads running North and West from said Sawmill. The Bearing and distance of said Road is as follows Beg. at a stone in public Road at lumber yard Thence across the breast of the dam South 67½ deg. East 10 per. to the gate set across the narrow passage at the end of said Sawmill from the gate it is five perches more being 15 per. to where the other public Road begins which runs up the creek; said gate being put there by orders of the said party or parties owning said Sawmill for the purpose of preventing persons from riding or driving so close to the Sawmill.

Thence from a hemlock stump at said logway of McElm
& Yorks Old Public Road North $38\frac{1}{2}$ deg. East 16 per. to stone;
Thence by said Road North $18\frac{1}{2}$ deg. East 8 per. to stone;
Thence by same North $33\frac{1}{2}$ deg. East 12 per. to a stone;
Thence by same North $58\frac{1}{2}$ deg. East 8 per. to a stump
on the other side of a Brook and within 2 rods
of line of lands of William Koppf which Road so
far if it please the Court and not being inconsistent
with law might be granted as a Private Road
for the use of William Koppf his heirs or assigns,
otherwise we ask it to be vacated as also the
following from the hemlock stump near said line
North 6 per. to a hemlock; Thence North 20 deg. West
18 per. to post in marsh; Thence North $4\frac{1}{2}$ deg. East $5\frac{1}{2}$ per
to hemlock; Thence North 20 deg. West $9\frac{1}{2}$ per. to hemlock
where it connects with the route newly laid out.
Then again to vacate. Beginning at a post in old
Road at the other intersection of new Road laid
out; Thence N. $62\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. 16 p. to post; Thence S. 69 ° E. 12
per. to post at the end of Bridge; Thence across the
Bridge which is in an unsafe condition N. 85 ° E.
10 p. to post; Thence S. 58 ° E. 4 per. to hemlock tree
which is the western terminus of a Public Road
laid out from here to George Hotzfelts sawmill in
1873 part of which Road which we shall also
ask to be vacated as much as becomes useless by
being supplied in this (this is not yet opened).
Thence from said hemlock by line of old Public
Road to be vacated N. $87\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. $25\frac{1}{2}$ per. to a post;
S. 70 ° E. 8 per. to hem. N. 86 ° E. $24\frac{1}{2}$ per. to post; N. 39 ° E.
 $3\frac{1}{2}$ per. across Brook to post; N. 72 ° E. 10 per. to post;
N. 21 ° E. 16 p. to post; N. 54 ° E. 16 p. to post; N. $48\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. 20
per. to post; N. 75 ° E. 12 p. to hem.; N. $40\frac{1}{2}$ ° E. 8 per. to Pub. Road
leading to Coal Hill Road

A Plot or draft whereof is herewith annexed
which said Road as we have laid it out
we report as necessary and also report to be
vacated what we have supplied in this
and we further report no damages to accrue
from said Road.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 19th day of March, A. D. 1875, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Brady, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ^{change of} road or highway, leading ~~from~~ West from Saw Mill

of McClure and Yoke on line of lands of Frederick
Knowl East to public road leading from David Ream's
Saw mill to Coal hill road, with power to
vacate and supply

Report as to damages &c

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{vacate} and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

David Ream Sam. G. Kuntz & Geo. H. Wingert

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ^{change of} road, they shall proceed to lay out ^{vacate & supply} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
