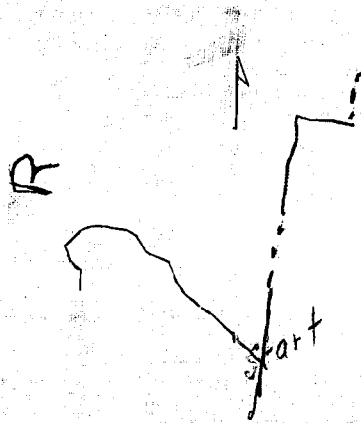

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the *Seventh* day of *June*, A. D. 187*J*, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Lawrence*, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from *near John D Butters or Levi Herricks to Jos Shaw's Saw Mill*

"Report as to Damages"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

John Shaw Jos Owens J L Cuttle

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of Clearfield,

The undersigned viewers duly appointed in and by virtue of the order of Court hereto annexed, Respectfully report.

That having first given due timely and legal notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers, by advertisements posted in public places for more than five days previous to making the view, and having been first duly sworn or affirmed according to law, they met upon the ground proposed for said road, and after examining the same proceeded to lay out a road according to the following courses and distances, Beginning at the Forks of Old and New road, below Shaw's Saw mill, (the old road from said point to Shaw's Saw mill being deserted for many years) thence by road $N 23^{\circ} W$ 18 perches, $N 49^{\circ} W$ 33 perches, $N 43^{\circ} W$ 32 perches, $N 68^{\circ} W$ 26 perches (at 3 per Shaw's dam) $N 51^{\circ} W$ 30 perches Headlock $N 58^{\circ} W$ 16 perches, $N 31^{\circ} W$ 20 perches, $N 14^{\circ} W$ at 8 per Lick Run to left, in all 12 per road to Doctor's Fork, $N 24^{\circ} W$ 26 per $N 66^{\circ} W$ 38 per, $N 45^{\circ} W$ 12 perches, $N 34^{\circ} W$ 34 per to Joseph Shaw's line, $N 53^{\circ} W$ 18 per to White Pine, $S 87^{\circ} W$ 8 per, $S 79^{\circ} W$ 22 perches $S 87^{\circ} W$ 10 per, $S 79^{\circ} W$ 22 per $S 87^{\circ} W$ 10 perches, $S 76^{\circ} W$ 12 per, $S 88^{\circ} W$ 26 per (at 10 per clearing) to M.
