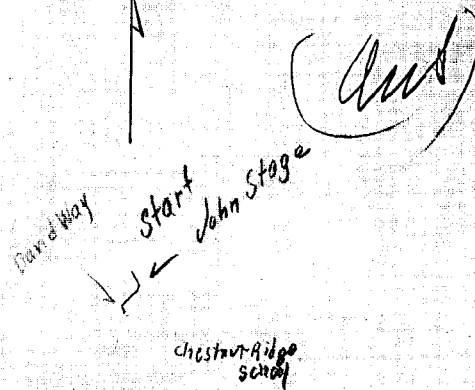

To the Honorable Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield
We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the foregoing order of Court to view & lay out the road therein described. Do Report that in pursuance of said appointment after first having given previous notice of more than five days of the time and place of said View we all met and being first duly Affirmed according to Law we did proceed to lay out and do return for Public use the following Road to wit
Beginning at a Post in line of David Way & Law Sykes thence through land of David Way & Hannah his wife South Seventeen degrees East, Thirty Perches to a Post thence still through the same North Eighty five degrees West Fifty Six perches to intersect the public Road to Chestnut Ridge a Plot or Draft whereof we herunto annex.
And we having enquired as to the damage resulting to any one by reason of the passage of said road have appraised and do allow that David Way is entitled to receive the sum of Thirty Dollars as damage to the property of the said David Way.

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the fifth day of October, A. D. 1875, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a ^{Public} road or highway, leading from Chestnut Ridge road in Pike Tp. and leading through to property of Law Sykes

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

T. H. Moore John Morris Sr and R. H. McKaul who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, ^{vacate and supply} as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

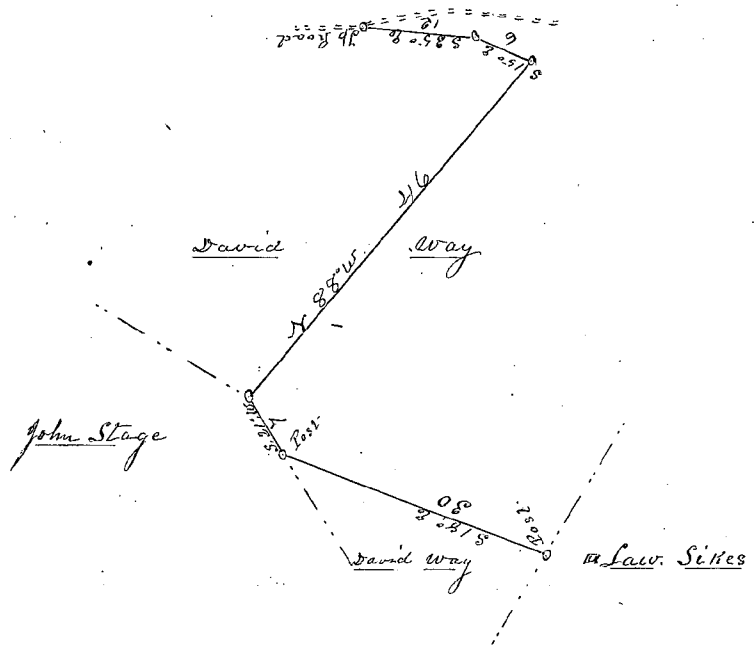

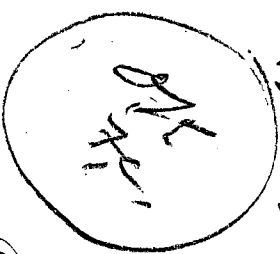
