

and inconvenient. The petitioners therefore
pray the Court to ingrine of, and abandon
said private road, and instead of which
road, to view and lay out a public
road, beginning at or near property
of Mr. C. Morris, on Chestnut ridge
road, leading through ~~and~~ to property
of Law Sykes and there ending, being
the present terminus of private road,
and for these purposes to appoint persons,
qualified according to law, to view
the said private road and proposed
public road, and report their
proceedings to next term of this
Court, and they will meet on
October 7th 1845.



Be the undersigned Viewers appointed by the fore-
going order of Court to view & lay out the road
therein described. Do Report that in pursuance
of said appointment after first having given
previous notice of more than five days of the time
and place of said view we all met and being
first duly Affirmed according to Law we
did proceed to lay out and do return for
Public use the following Road to Wit
Beginning at a Post in line of David May & Law
Syses there through land of David May & Hannah
his wife. South Seventeen degrees East, Thirty
Perches to a Post there still through the same
North Eighty five degrees west. Fifty Six per-
ches to intersect the public Road to Chestnut Ridge
a Plot or Draft whereof we hereunto annex.

And we having enquired as to the damage re-
sulting to any one by reason of the passage of
said road have appraised and do allow
that David Day is entitled to receive the sum
of Thirty Dollars as damage to the property
of the said David Day

ROAD VIEWER'S REPORT.


CLEARFIELD COUNTY SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the fifth day of October, A. D. 1875, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Pike, in the said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from Chestnut Ridge road in
Pike Tp and leading through to property of Law
Sykes

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

P. H. Moore John Morris Sr and R H McNaul
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to vacate and supply the same, agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.



We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Courts, to review, vacate, and supply the Road, from Law Sikes, to the public Road, at, or near M. C. Morris in Pitt Township. Respectfully report, that having given notice of the time, and place of meeting, according to the Act of Assembly, and being all present at the view of the ground, proposed for the said Road. And having all been sworn, or affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order. We have reviewed, laid out; and do return the following Road, viz. -- Beginning at a Post on the line between David Way and Law Sikes. Thence by a line of marked trees, through David Way's land, South eighteen degrees East, Thirtys (30) perches, to a Post on the line of John Stage. Thence through his land South twenty one degrees west, (S. 21. W.) Seven (7) perches, to a Post, Thence through Land of Stage, and David Way. North eighty eight, degrees west (N. 88. W.) forty six (46) perches. Thence still on David Way's land, South fifteen degrees, (S. 15. E) East, six (6) perches, South thirty five degrees East, (S. 35. E) twelve (12) perches, to the public Road near M. C. Morris. Which said road, as aforesaid laid out, we are of opinion is necessary for a public road. A draft whereof is herunto annexed.
