Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 13 day of June, A. D. 1875, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the West end of Summit Tunnel to a point on public road leading to Rockton in Union Tp

Report as to damages re

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

L. Bird Jacob Rosenbaum & S. Brown

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road, and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Court of Common Pleas of Clearfield County Pa.

As directed by your order of June 13, 1875, hereto attached we proceeded to examine the route as laid by a former view - No. 11 - June 1874 also the route proposed as a substitute and are convinced that the change should be made in order to accommodate the inhabitants from both directions. L. Bird ^{of Clearfield} Rosenbaum & S. Brown Jr. were sworn and S. Brown Jr. affirms -

We laid out the road as follows. Beginning in the public highway eight rods west of the Summit Tunnel School House thence through land of John Dubeis

N. 83° W. eight perches to a smallish stream S. 66° W. twenty nine 1/4 perches to a stump thence S. 72° W. twenty two perches to a maple thence S. 52° W. fourteen 3/4 perches to a small dam -

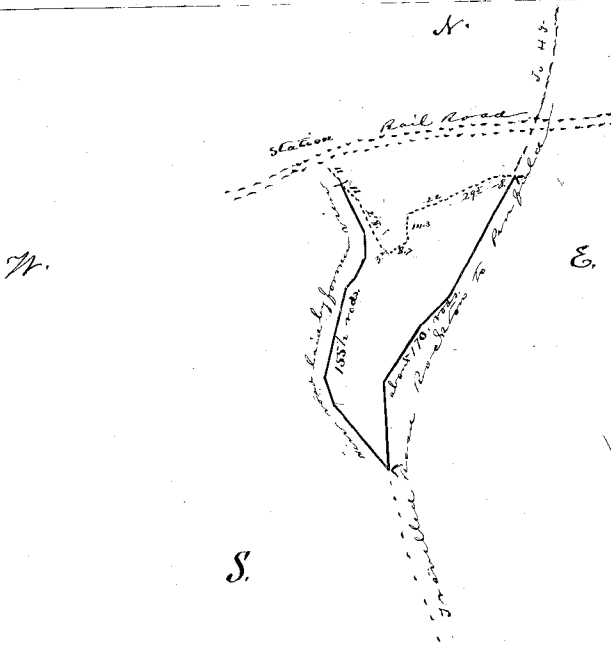
thence S. 56° W. eight 1/2 perches to a small stream thence S. 53° W. 20

thence 7 1/2 perches to a smallish stream thence N. 25° W. twenty eight perches to a spruce in the former survey thence N. 46° W. passing the brush stump occurred in said survey continue in all twenty two perches to the Rail Road West of Summit.
