of Quarter Sessions of Clearfield Co.

The petition of the undersigned respectfully represents - That a public road has been long since laid out in Bell Township in said County, beginning at T. A. McGee's saw mill and ending at a point at or near Hillman's rock; and that said road has become inconvenient and burdensome in its present location, and would better accommodate the public travel by being changed so as to begin and end at the same points, but that it be vacated and supplied at the following places - viz: At H. W. Motts farm so that it do not run through said farm as reported but remain as now located around it - Also at Samuel McGee's Hill so that the road may run on the line between said McGee's land and that of Huston Beatty - Also at Huston Beatty's Hill in such a manner as that the grade may be lighter and the travelling over it made easier than at present, the grade at present being too steep - Also that it be changed at Daniel Bonches Hill so that it may go around it instead of over it as at present located -

The petitioners therefore pray the Court
to inquire of and ^{locate and supply} change the said
in the manner specified, and for
that purpose to appoint three per-
sons qualified according to law to
view the said road and ground
proposed for the said changes, and
make report of their proceedings at next
term of this Court.

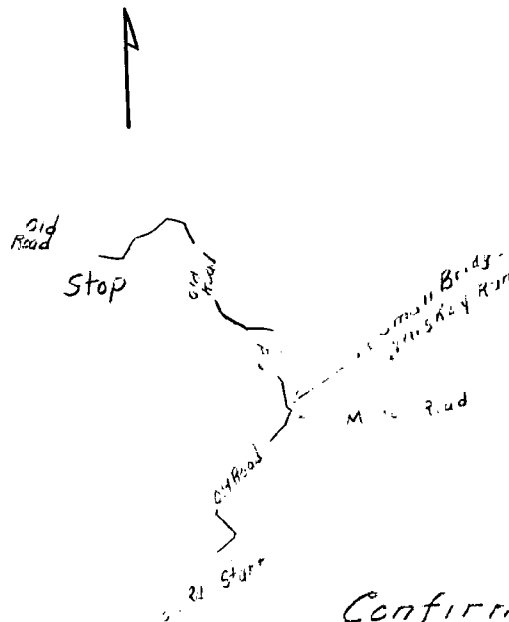

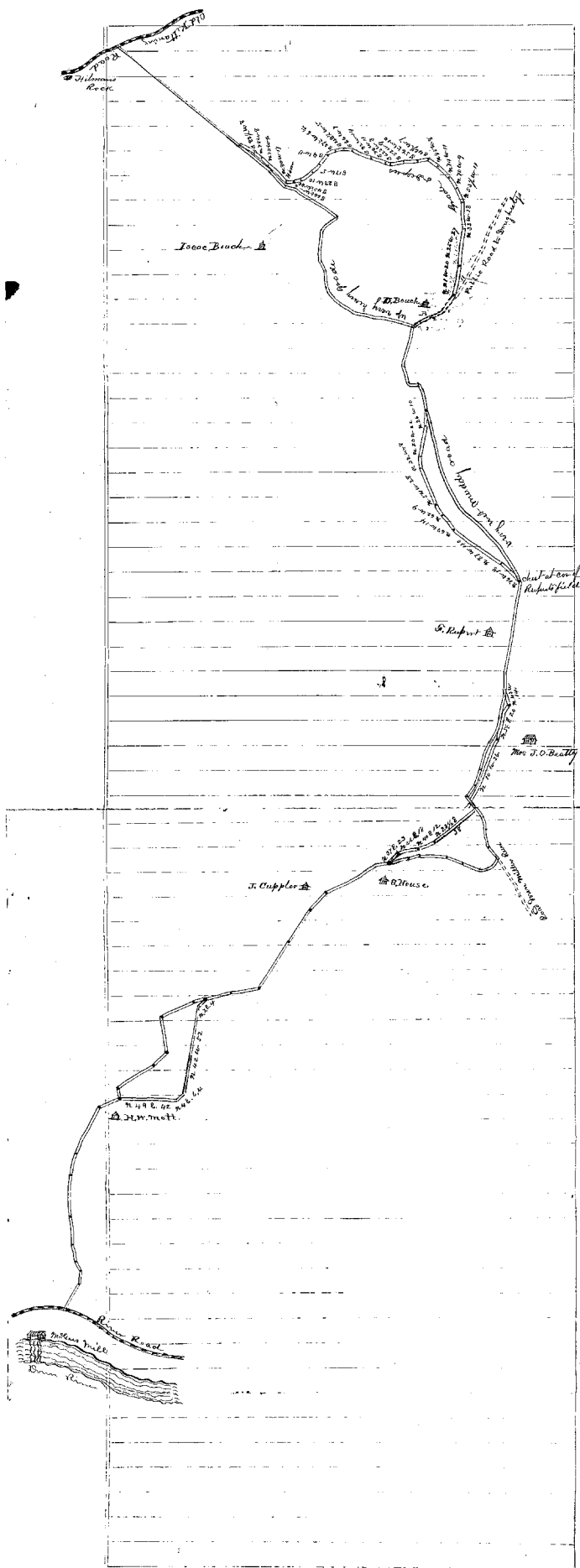

To the Honorable Judges of our Court of Common Pleas
for Clearfield County,

We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to view the road there in described Do Report &c. That in pursuance of said appointment, after having first given due notice according to Law of the time & place of meeting. We all met, and after being duly affirmed, did proceed to make said changes as desired by the inhabitants along said road. First Beginning at a Post in said road near Homer W. Moads house thence North 49° S. East 42 Perches North 4 S. East 6 $\frac{7}{10}$ perches, North 42 S. East 52 perches North 7 degrees East, 4 Perches to intersect said road again. Then Beginning at a Post in said road about ten Perches North of Cripples School House thence North 37 degrees East, 23 Perches to a Chestnut, North 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East, 18 Perches, North 40 degrees East 12 Perches to a Hemlock, North 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ S. East, 38 perches to the Miller road thence North 50 S. East, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ Perches across Small Bro. Whiskey run, North 10 S. East 36 perches to a Post on the upper side of the road, North 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ S. East, 20 per to Post in Bratty fields, North 43 S. East, 14 Perches to Post in road on top of hill. X Then Began at a Chest-bud at cor of Ruperts field, N. 76° W. 18 perches, N. 87° W. 40. Perches, N. 69° W. 14 to 2^d Chest-bud, N. 62° W. 9 perches to a Dogwood, N. 54° W. 28 perches to a Maple, N. 32° W. 8 perches to a Hemlock, North 20 S. East 22 Per, North 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 10 perches to intersect road near the top of the hill South East of Cummins Sawmill, Then from a Post in Public road leading to Dougherty at the corner of Sam Bouchs field ran N 21° W 20 Per, N 25° W 27 Perches to a Maple, N 53 $\frac{1}{2}$ W 11 per to Hemlock, N 70 W 9 perches N 74 W 11 Per to a 3^d Birch N 85 W 8 Per, S. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 7 Per, S 56 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 10 Perches, S 52° W 9 per to Hemlock, S. 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 3 per, S 76 W 11 Per S 82 W 14 Per to a Rock, S. 66 W 7 Per S. 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 5 Perches S 37 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ Perches to Hemlock, S. 9 W. 11 Per, S. 17 W 5 perches

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 19. day of March, A. D. 1875, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of Bell, ^{change in} in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from J. A. McGees Saw Mill to Hillsmans Rock. Asking to be changed as follows at H. W. Motts far as to go around in stead of through it - at Sam McGees hill so that the McGees and H. Beatys - at H. Beatys Hill so that the grade may be made lighter and easier to travel - and at Han Bouches Hill so that it may go around in stead of over it ~~as~~ at present located

"Report as to damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view ^{vacate & supply} ~~and lay out~~ the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Thomas W Moore John Bell and David Mcracken

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such ^{change of} road, they shall proceed to lay out ^{vacate & supply} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
