

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 19 day of June, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township ~~Burnside~~ ^{Burnside} County, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from ~~Cemetery in the Borough~~ ^{Burnside and leading to the Indiana County} line and known as the old Indiana Road.

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ~~E. H. M. Moore~~ ^{E. H. M. Moore} ~~W. J. Kime~~ ^{W. J. Kime} & ~~David Smith~~ ^{David Smith} ~~J. A. Smith~~ ^{J. A. Smith} who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable Judges of the Court of Quarter
Sessions of Cuyahoga County:

We the undersigned
Viewers appointed by the foregoing Order of Court to
view the road therein described. Do Report that in
pursuance of said appointment after first having given
due notice according to law of the time and place of said
view by written & printed notices of the same and also
having given notice to owners & occupants of land through
which said road was intended to pass of the time & place of
meeting, and having enquired as to the damage resulting
to any one by reason of the passing of said road - we have
ascertained that no damage results to any one -
and being duly sworn & affirmed according to law
we have proceeded to view - lay out and do return for
public use the following road - Viz - Beginning
at a Post on the Public road leading from Burnsides
by the Cemetery near the foot of the Hill & west of said
Cemetery. thence South Seventy four degrees west. nine perches
thence South Sixty five degrees west. thirty four perches to a Bush
thence South Eighty two & one half degrees west. Six perches to a
Hemlock. thence North Seventy six degrees west. thirty four
perches to a Sugar tree. North fifty nine degrees west. four & one half
perches - North forty one degrees west. Sixteen per - North
thirty eight degrees west. twelve per - North forty six degrees west
thirteen per - to a post in corner of A B. Davis field. thence through
same South Sixty nine degrees West. thirty three perches to the
Indiana road & by same North Sixty six degrees west. forty
two perches to the Indiana County line. a draft or diagram
of which we herunto annex.
