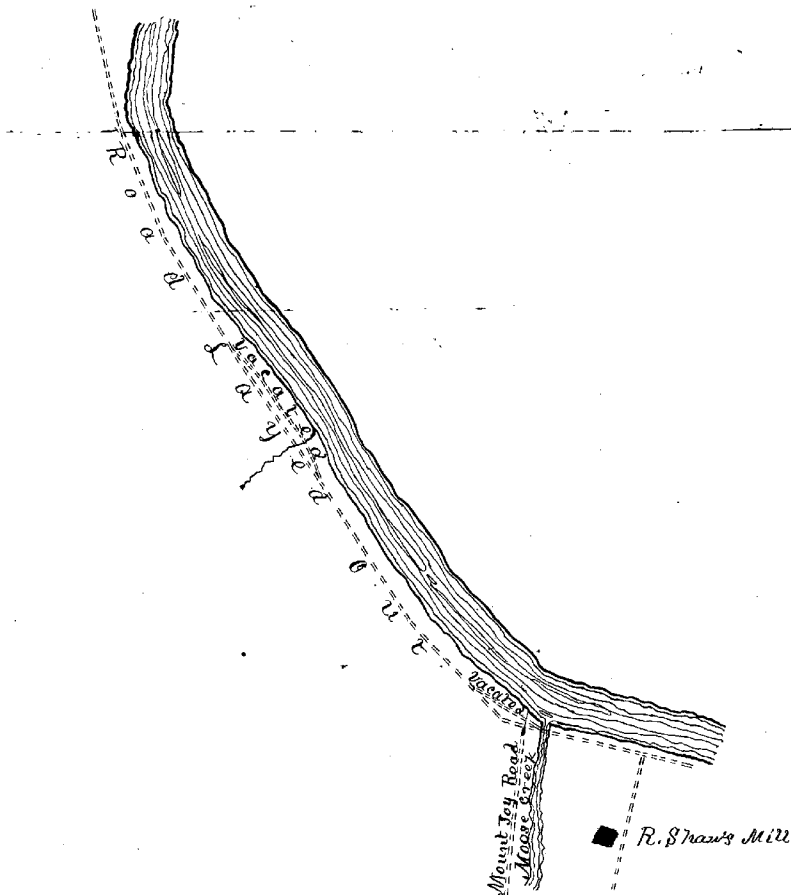
James Mitchell Henry Mead & A. Humphrey
who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out ^{vacate} the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County of Clearfield; We the persons appointed by the within order of Court to view ^{vacate} & lay out the road therein mentioned do report:—That after giving due public notice of the time and place of meeting we met agreeably thereto on the 18 day of May A.D. 1875 and after being severally affirmed according to law we proceeded to view and layout and believing the same to be necessary, & do now return for public use the following road to wit:—

Beginning where the road now in use comes to the river near John Smith's thence on said road now in use S. 69° W. 20 per. thence S. 60° W. 22 per. thence leaving the said road now in use S. 58° W. 24.5 per. to said road again thence continuing same course (S. 58° W.) 27.5 per. thence still continuing on said road S. 48° W. 16 per. thence continuing same course S. 48° W. leaving the said road now in use 6 per. to within 1/2 per. of the end of R. Shaw Jr board-fence near intersection of Mount Joy Road thence S. 16° W. at dis of 7.5 per. come back to said road again where the same crosses the mouth of Moose Creek thence continuing same course (S. 16° W.) at dis of 25 per. end of view at intersection of road leading to R. Shaw's Jr. Grist Mill near the same. we also further report that all those parts of the road now in use on which this view is not laid are to sundriesome to be kept up.
