Twp of Pike for the several reasons

First that the two Points
named in said ^{Road} can be reached by
two other Roads running parallel
with said Road not over a mile from
said new location

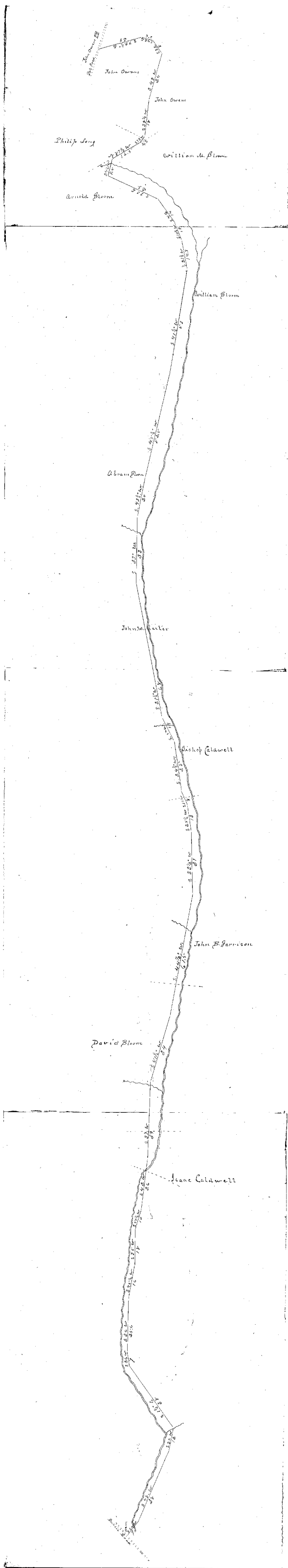
Second that said Road is located

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within Order of Court, do now and lay out the road therein mentioned, Respect-fully reports: that after giving notice of the time, and place of the law according to the Act of Assembly; and being all present, at the view of the ground proposed for the said road; and being all sworn, or affirmed, in pursuance of the said Order, we have viewed, and laid out; and do return the following Road, viz: Beginning at a Hemlock by the public Road, "near" the mouth of Hogback Run, and then up said Run. Thence a land of John B. Harrison, and land of Alexander Potter fixed, south fifty four degrees west. Nine perches, thence south forty eight degrees west thirty eight perches, south thirty six degrees west, twelve perches south one and a half degrees west, thirty eight perches, south twenty six degrees, west; thence perches, south thirty six degrees west, twenty five and six south half degrees west, distance perches, south thirty

five degrees west Eighteen perches, South fifty one and a half degrees west Ten perches, South forty two degrees west Twenty six perches, Thence through Land of Isaac Caldwell, South thirty seven degrees west, thirty nine perches, Thence through Land of David Bloom, South fifty one and a half degrees west, thirty four perches, Thence through John B. Garrison's Land, South forty four and a half degrees west, sixty one and five tenths perches, Thence South thirty two and a half degrees west, thirty one perches, South twenty five and a half degrees west, thirteen perches, South eleven degrees west, eight perches, Thence through Land of Bishop Caldwell, South twenty four and a half degrees west, twenty five perches, South five degrees west, fourteen perches, South twenty one and a half degrees west, (Through Land of John W. Reiter) sixty eight perches, South thirty three degrees west, thirty three perches, Thence through Land of Abram Bloom, South forty three and a half degrees west, twenty perches, South forty five and a half degrees west, fifty two and five tenths perches.

South forty one and a half degrees west, through Land of William M. Bloom, fifty three perches, South twenty one and a half degrees west, fourteen and three tenths perches, South ten and a half degrees west, ten perches, South four degrees East, fourteen perches, South thirty three degrees East, twenty eight perches, South forty six degrees west, eight and five tenths perches, Thence on the line between William M. Bloom and Philip Long, North eighty seven and a half degrees west, fifteen and five tenths perches, Thence through Land of Philip Long and Land of John Owens, South seventy three degrees west, four and three tenths perches, South thirty eight and a half degrees west, eighteen perches, South forty eight degrees west, twenty four perches, South three degrees East, eight perches, South forty two degrees East, five and six tenths perches, South seventy two and a half degrees East, twenty three perches, to the public Road near John Owens. A draft whereof is herewith annexed.

Which said Road as above described we are of opinion is necessary for a public Road. And we are also of opinion that the afore-said laid out Road, will be of no damage to any private property through which it passes.

1. Because there was a road
formerly laid out between the
same points, and ^{recently} vacated by
the Court, on the ground that it
was not necessary, there being
other parallel public roads
between the same points.
2. Because the viewers did not
give personal notice to the owners
of land through which the road
passes, as required by Rules of Court.
3. Because it was the duty
of the viewers to secure, if pos-
sible, releases for damages from
owners of land through which the
road passes, which they did not
attempt to procure.
4. Because the viewers did not report
as to the character of the route
or to improvements as required
by the order to view.
5. That the Petition was not ~~pre-~~
presented by Counsel, nor made in
such durable and legible form
that it can be preserved as a
record of the proceeding.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS:

adjourned
At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the *tenth* day of *November*, A. D. 187*3*, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of *Pike*, in said county, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway, leading from *a public Road in Lawrence Township at or near the mouth of Hog Back Run to intersect the public Road at or near John Owens in Pike Township*

"Report as to damages &c"

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Sam F. McCloskey Ben. Hartshorn & John B. Garrison

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make

report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
