agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the County of Bedford.

The undersigned, members appointed to view and lay out the road mentioned in the order of Court hereto annexed.

Respectfully Report,

That they gave suitably and legal notice of the time and place of the meeting of the viewers by advertisements duly posted in the Township of Bedford, for more than five days previous to making the view, and being duly sworn according to law, met upon the ground proposed for said road after examining the same, proceeded to lay out and now return the following courses and distances. Beginning at the township road on Richard Shaw's lane, thence by lane S 68° E. 33 perches, (to township) S 12° E ten perches, S 44° E eight perches, S 61° E six perches, S 31° E eight perches, S 45° E ten perches, S 52° E fourteen perches, S 70° E ten perches, S 43° E six perches to crop run to left S 88° E fourteen perches to white pine stub, to east fourteen perches to timberline, S 88° E ten perches to old road, and S 61° E thirty four perches (through field of Archibald Shaw 33 per) to River Road below the buildings of J. Shaw, in all one hundred and twenty seven perches, which we consider necessary for the convenience of the people, and return the same for Public use, all which is respectfully submitted. Draught annexed.

And we allow the sum of Thirty three Dollars to Archibald Shaw, for damages sustained, and the new fence required through his wheat field, it requiring fifty six perches of new fence.
