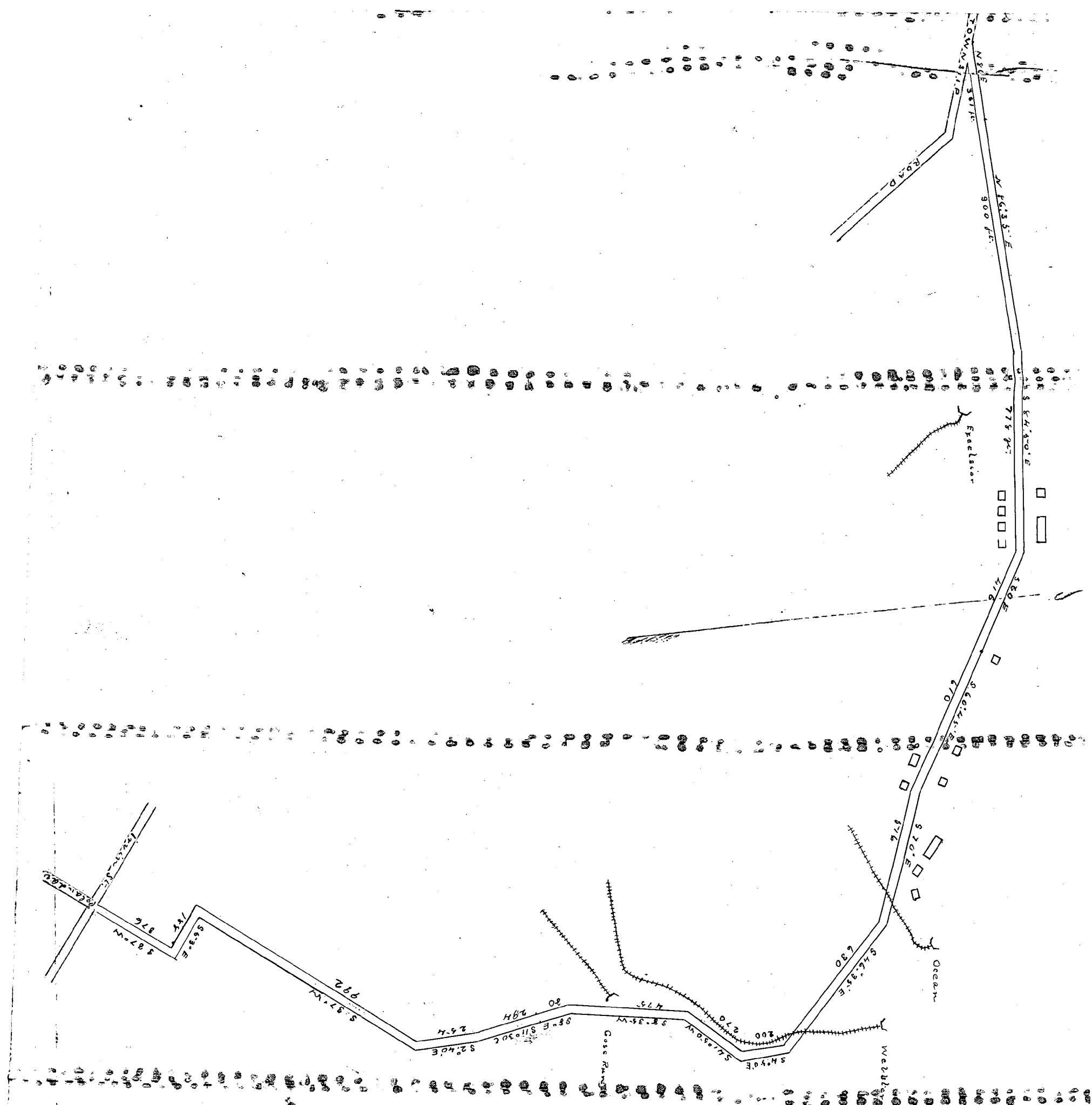
Below you will please find report of viewing done for

Order of Court dated March 28th 1876; also find plan
of said road with courses and distances attached;

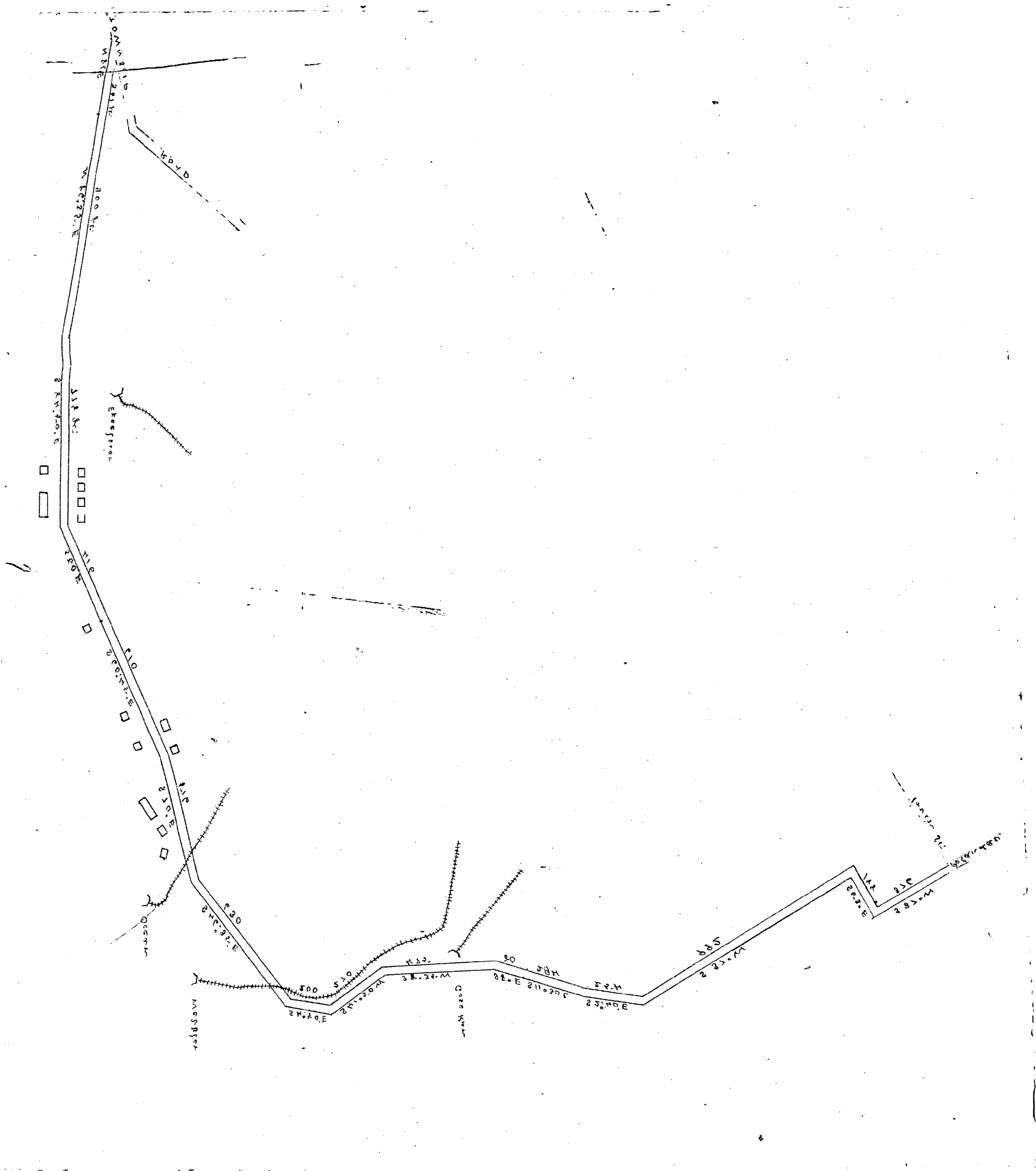
Having been duly sworn according to law by
Eugene Shaw of Houtzdale we hereby affix a description
of courses &c of the road and attach our names thereto;

Fisher & Miller's farm, thence N. 86° E. 361 feet to a post; thence
N. 86° 35' E. 900 feet to a post; thence S. 84° 50' E. 778 feet to
a post; thence S. 60° E. 416 feet to a post; thence S. 60° 45' E.
610 feet to a post; thence S. 70° E. 516 feet to a post; thence
S. 46° 35' E. 630 feet to a post; thence S. 4° 50' E. 200 feet to
a post; thence S. 41° 50' W. 270 feet to a post; thence S. 8° 35' W.
475 feet to a post; thence S. 8° E. 80 feet to a post; thence
S. 11° 30' E. 294 feet to a post; thence S. 2° 40' E. 254 feet to a
post; thence S. 37° W. 992 feet to a post; thence S. 53° E. 188
feet to a post; thence S. 37° W. 376 feet to corner of Irwin Street
& Island Avenue in general plan of the town of North Houtzdale.

Road Viewers' Report.

CLEARFIELD COUNTY, SS.:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Clearfield, held at Clearfield, in and for said county, on the 28 day of Mar, A. D. 1876, before the Judges of the said Court, upon the petition of sundry inhabitants of the township of, ~~in said county~~ Woodward, setting forth that they labor under great inconvenience for the want of a road or highway leading from the Township road running past the Fisher & Miller farm to intersect the Township road at or near Houtzville

And therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law. Whereupon, the Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

Geo Wooden S Anderson and J. B. Frazier

who, after being respectively sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their appointment with impartiality and fidelity, are to view the ground proposed for said road; and if any two of them agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be, having respect for the best ground for a road, and the shortest distance, in such manner as to do the least injury to private property; and shall make report thereof, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, with reference to the improvements through which it may pass, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county. In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.
